Workers' comp rates to be lower soon

Governor George E. Pataki has announced that workers' compensation rates will be reduced this year by an average of 2.5 percent. The reduction, combined with rate decreases achieved in the past five years, represents an overall reduction of almost 40 percent.

The 2.5 percent reduction will take effect October 1, 2000, and will be reflected in rate notices that insurers will send to employers immediately. The decreases will vary by business and type of industry, but some employers will see their rates fall by as much as 27 percent for the coming year such as those in the tunneling and iron and steel erection classes.

The Safety and Security Act also repealed Dole v. Dow, reducing costs for employers. The 1972 Court of Appeals decision had permitted manufacturers of equipment that caused a workplace injury to recover damages from the injured worker's employer, costing New York employers more than \$300 million every year. New York had been the only state that subjected its employers to such unlimited liability from a "third party lawsuit."

In 1995 rates were reduced by 8.4 percent and in 1996 rates fell by more than 18 percent. In 1997 rates decreased an additional 7.5 percent and in 1998 rates were cut by 3 percent. Last year's rate level was unchanged. Prior to the enactment of the Governor's reform legislation, New York State had the second highest workers' compensation costs in the United States.

Councilman Brownell resigns

Board likely to name his replacement in August

At a special meeting of the Easton Town Board Monday evening, the board announced the resignation of Councilman Richard G. Brownell, Sr.

In his written resignation dated and made effective July 11, Brownell cited "personal reasons" as the cause for his decision. He went on to state that as a taxpayer he plans to stay informed and active on issues before the board for the benefit of all taxpayers and that he will oppose any issue that is in the personal interest of anyone.

The board passed a resolution accepting his resignation with regret, and thanking him for his 2½ years of service to the town. A discussion concerning the naming of his replacement ensued, and it was decided that anyone wishing to sit on the town council should send a letter of interest to be received by the town clerk not later than 5 p.m. on August 15.

The question as to whether or not the board would actually fill the vacancy was left unanswered, since Councilman James Borden was not present to provide his input into the process. The matter will be taken up again at the regular August meeting, following the public hearing on the revision of the junk car ordinance. If a successor to Brownell is to be chosen, the decision will be made at a special meeting of the board to be held on August 15.

While Brownell's resignation came as a surprise to the board majority, there were obviously persons in town who knew it was pending, one of whom circulated a nominating petition for the council seat before it was vacated.

Brownell's term would have expired on December 31, 2001. The petition, however, was rejected by the county board of elections because the resignation came within 7 days of the closing date for filing Republican nominating petitions for the next general election.

According to Supervisor Dan Shaw, should the board choose a successor to Brownell, his term would end at the end of December 2000.

The Easton Town Republican Committee is charged with the responsibility of placing a candidate on the November ballot to fill the remaining year of Brownell's term.

Planning board to meet on Tuesday

The Easton Town Planning Board will hold a regular meeting Tuesday, July 25, at Burton Hall at 8 p.m.

Applications, or sketch plan materials should be submitted to the clerk 10 days prior to the meeting time, and may be dropped off at the Town Clerk's office during town office hours. While the town has new telephone numbers, telephone messages for the Planning Board and the Planning Board Clerk may still be left at the clerk's home number.

Sketch plan/minor subdivision procedures, and application forms are available from the Town office, or the

Planning Board Clerk. Sketch plan proposal requirements include a drawing of the proposed subdivision based on a tax map or similarly accurate map; copies of deeds, 1969 (or before) to present owner of record; and a notarized agency designation form if the applicant is other than the present owner of record.

Building permit applications for lands within flood plain areas will begin with application to the Planning Board for a flood plain permit review in accordance with the Town 1998 Flood Plain Law.

Funds allotted for senior programs

The New York State budget recently signed by Governor George Pataki has increased state funding for several important programs and services provided to senior citizens by the Washington County Office for the Aging.

Statewide, funding allocated by the state Office for the Aging increased over \$9 million to more than \$66 million for such services as home delivered meals, in-home services and community services for the elderly.

Allocations for Washington County include: Community Services for the Elderly program - \$65,819; Expanded in-home services for the elderly program - \$100,071; and supplemental nutrition assistance program - \$129,512.

This funding will allow Washington County to continue, and in some cases, improve the services it provides to older residents.
