Pal-Mac Graduate Lisa Hunt Dies in Perinton Auto Accident

Eighteen year old Lisa Hunt of Macedon, died at 6:24 Sunday morning (August 26) from complications suffered during a one car auto accident last Sunday in Perinton. Lisa was apparently on her way to work at Eastview Mall, when the accident occurred.

According to **Captain Douglas Swetman** of the Monroe County Sheriff's Department, a neighbor saw the accident and called for help. The Egypt Fire Department was first on the scene.

The police report noted that Ms. Hunt apparently lost control of her car on Wilkinson Road just east of Egypt-Victor Road at about 12:18 p.m. on August 19th. She was traveling west-bound on Wilkinson when her vehicle left the pavement on the north side, striking a bridge abutment. The car, a two door white Ford, continued north-bound travelling down a culvert and came to rest in a small stream with its right side facing up. Lisa was unconscious when ambulance workers arrived. Egypt Fire personnel used the "Jaws of Life" (a device used by rescue workers to pry victim's from auto wrecks) to free her. Perinton and Macedon Ambulance companies also assisted. Lisa was taken by Perinton Ambulance to Strong Memorial Hospital.

According to her aunt, **Debbie White**, Lisa was a runner-up in the Wayne County Fair Queen Pageant in 1987 and was a very pretty, popular, vibrant and likable girl. She graduated in June from Pal-Mac High School, where she was a varsity cheerleader.

Lisa had planned to attend Cazenovia College, according to the Pal-Mac High School yearbook. School principal **Michael Ormsby** stated that Lisa was "well thought of — a contributing part of her class, and a real

asset to the school. She always seemed to be hustling about and was a very vivacious girl, with high energy; always on the move."

Lisa is the second student from Palmyra-Macedon to die in a car accident this summer. In July, **Angelique P. Williams**, 17 of Canandaigua Road, Palmyra was killed in a two car accident on Yellow Mills Road.

Principal Ormsby noted: "We've had an inordinate amount of sorrow as it relates to the community this past summer."

Lisa is survived by her parents, **Sandi and Freeman Hunt** of Erie Street Road in Macedon and her brother, **Eric**, age 13.

Calling hours will be from 7-9 Tuesday evening and from 2-4 and 7-9 Wednesday at the Payne-Nulton Funeral Home, 24 Bickford Road, Macedon. Services will be held Thursday morning at 11:00 at the Macedon Center United Methodist Church at 1160 Macedon Center Road.

The classes will run for eight consecutive Tuesday nights from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. They will be taught by **Vicky Fideor, R.D.** - a registered dietician - and will include topics regarding good, basic nutrition, modifying behavior, exercise, weight loss, and choosing foods wisely.

"This is an introduction, a place to start. This class is a good way to introduce people to me and to get weight programs going out here," said Vicky. "It is not a crash diet. It is a sensible approach to dieting for people wishing to lose between 5 and 30 pounds. I don't think quick weight loss is a good weight loss. I emphasize low fat foods, moderate protein and exercise. Women on the program would normally have between 1000 and 1200 calories per day, and men 1500 to 1600 per day," she explained.

Vicky stated that most people need some type of structure to start out with

AFTERMATH OF A FIRE . . . Pope Family Resettles in Walworth

Eight months after a fire that destroyed their home and devastated their lives (four days before Christmas 1989), the Pope family of Walworth are secure in their new home on the site of the one they lost. "We loved that house, it needed work, but we loved it," said **Beth Pope** of the home she and husband Doug purchased last June at 3574 Main Street in Walworth. "The ironic thing is that we moved in here just 2 weeks short of the day we originally moved into our first one," Beth reported.

The chain of events that led from last Christmas til now are of interest to many readers of the TIMES, for they played an intregal part in the lives of the Pope family that Christmas. A fund was set up for monetary donations, and a special Christmas tree was erected where Walworth and surrounding area residents could bring toys, clothing, blankets etc. for the family.

It was a very hard Christmas, Beth remembers, but it was filled with many

caring people. "I don't know how we would have gotten through it without all the help. I'd still like to thank everyone for caring," she said.

After the December 21st fire, Beth, Doug and their two children Collin (then 7 months) and Tristin (then 3 years old) went to stay with Beth's parents **Nancy and Bob Flick** of Marion. On January 13th, the family located a house for rent in Penfield. A relative of the owner was handling the sale of the house at the time, but Beth said she was not aware that a sale was pending. "Two days after we moved in, a man pulled in the driveway and said 'Hi, I own this house now.'

"I was shocked. We already had the rugs pulled out from under us once. We had really struggled to find a place, and it wasn't really a convenient spot since it was 14 miles from my mother's and she was watching the kids, so I could go back to school," remembered Beth. "But
