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CHAPPAQUA CO-OP DRIVE

Plans for a membership and stock drive were approved on Saturday night, November 24th, at a meeting of the Chappaqua Cooperative at Saint John's Parish House, Pleasantville. A goal of ten thousand dollars in new capitol stock was set, to be devoted to modernizing the Chappaqua and Pleasantville stores, installing a meat department in the Pleasantville store, and increasing the inventory and services of the cooperative.

Norman Dieter, Treasurer, reported that for the first time since 1940, the two stores showed an operating margin for the first ten months of 1945. The guest speaker of the evening, Mr. Hugh Wolf, president of the Eastern Cooperative League, spoke of plans for post-war development of the Eastern Wholesale Cooperative, and said that Chappaqua Cooperative's present volume of business warranted

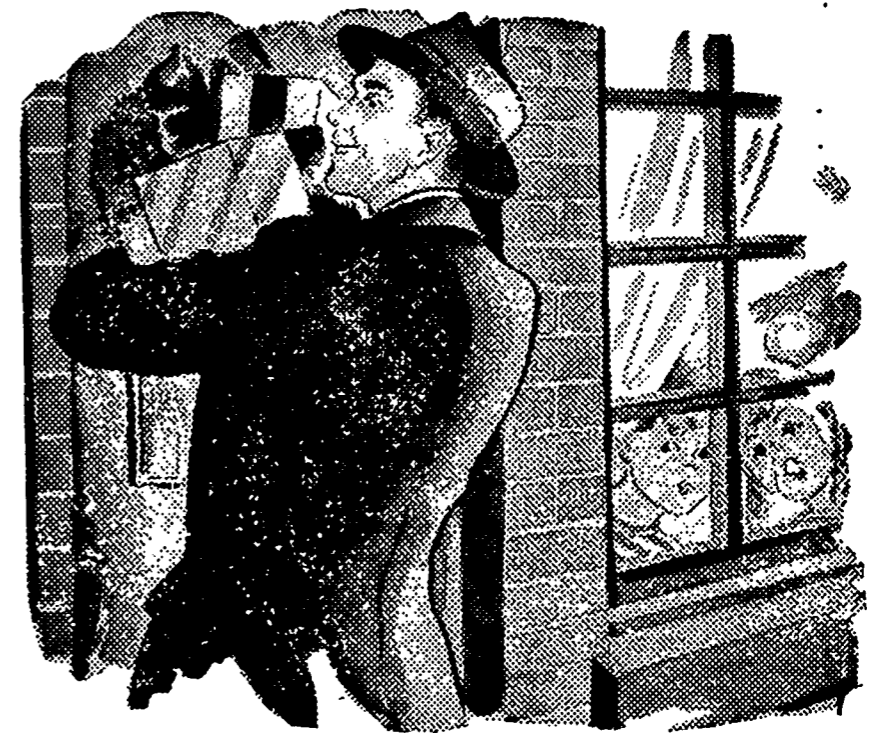
