The planting program being
sponsored by the Millwood Wo-

station plaza at Millwood are
beginning to show color from
the young plants recently set out
there. Although the project was

spreading yew trees at the post

time in helping to plan the pro-
gram, in digging the beds at the
station plaza and putting in the

from Mr. Smith which he has

planting season rolls around.

wonderful job in putting up a
retaining stone wall at the post-
office area and planting colorful

annuals around the yew trees.

planting could be done. Stewart

and Buddy Manchester gave a
helping hand too.
