

Armonk seniors plan package tours for fall

ARMONK — The North Castle Adult Club has completed plans for several fall and winter excursions. A day trip to Museum Village of Smith Cove in Monroe, N.Y., is scheduled for September 27.

This typical old time village has shops like those of the late 1800's, including candle and soap making, harness making, blacksmith and tinsmith shops and a general store. Cost for transportation and admission is \$4.50. The bus will leave the Adult Club at 9:45 a.m. Lunch can be purchased there but it is advisable to bring it.

A fall foliage tour is planned for October 22 to 25. First stop will be the Jug End Resort in the Berkshires. Bus tours from

there will go to the Crane Museum, where 90 per cent of the world's paper currency is made. Jennifer House, a world famous mail order house, and Bash Bish Falls.

Wednesday the group will head for Sturbridge Village, Mass., to stay at Orchard Inn. A visit to old Sturbridge Village and St. Ann's Shrine will be the highlights of this portion of the tour. Cost of this trip for double occupancy accommodations, meals and gratuities, admission fees, taxes and transportation is \$104 for single occupancy, add \$24. Not included are two lunch stops. The bus, which will leave the Adult Club October 22 at 9:15 a.m. and return October 25 at approximately 5:30 p.m., will remain with the group during the entire trip.

There will be a Christmas shopping trip to Cross County Center, Yonkers, November 1 with the bus leaving at 9:45 a.m. Transportation cost is \$25. A trip to Radio City Music Hall for the Christmas show is on the agenda November 29 at 10:30 a.m.

BOND RESOLUTION DATED AUGUST 27, 1973

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,000 SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE OF PLEASANTVILLE, WESTCHESTER COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO THE COST OF THE RECONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC SIDEWALKS IN SAID VILLAGE.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Pleasantville, Westchester County, New York, as follows:

Section 1 For the purpose of paying the cost of the reconstruction of public side walks in the Village of Pleasantville, Westchester County, New York, there are hereby authorized to be issued \$10,000 serial bonds of said village, it being hereby determined that such authorization is for a class of objects or purposes.

Section 2 The total estimated cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is \$10,000 and the plan of financing thereof by the issuance of \$10,000 serial bonds of said village hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

Section 3 Said bonds will be in the principal amount of \$10,000 and will be serial bonds. Further details concerning said bonds will be prescribed in a further resolution or resolutions of this Board of Trustees.

Section 4 Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes, in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized including renewals of such notes is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents and shall be sold in such manner as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5 It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid object or purpose is five years, pursuant to subdivision 2a of paragraph 1 of Section 11-00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the proposed maturity of the aforesaid bonds hereby authorized will not be in excess of five years.

Section 6 The faith and credit of said village of Pleasantville, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual ad valorem tax to be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable on such bonds.

Section 7 The cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes will be charged primarily to benefited real property in said village.

Section 8 The validity of such bonds or bond anticipation notes may be contested only if such obligations were authorized for an object or purpose for which said village was not authorized to expend money or if the provisions of law which should have been complied with as of the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with and an action suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced by the plaintiff within twenty days after the date of such publication or

Section 9 This resolution which takes effect immediately shall be published in full in Pleasantville Journal together with a notice of the Village Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81-00 of the Local Finance Law.
