British and American Trade.

From the Washington Chronicle.

It is interesting to note the current of trade between the United States and Great Britain since the commencement of the present civil war, in comparison with that of the time of peace. The blockade of the South has suspended for the time almost entirely the supplies of cotton, and this article having for many years constituted the basis of commerce with the two countries, will deprive us of the first attention. The value of cotton exports from the United States, which we find in the report on our foreign and domestic commerce, "we find the following figures for the last four years:

In 1861, \$4,464,000; for 1862, 7,471,000; for 1863, 10,000; for 1864, 120,762,000. A yet, in something more than the fourth part of the time, the value of cotton exports from the United States for the first six years of the civil war, was \$1,000,000.
