Report of The Commissioner of Public Works. To the Honorable the Board of Trustees of the Village of Mount Vernon: GENTLEMEN—I have the honor to submit the following report for two weeks ending February 15th, 1891.

On Sunday the Rev. Dr. Churchill of Southtown, Conn., presided at Grace Church, morning service at 10 o'clock. R. Foley was at the Epiphany, Southtown, Conn. In the afternoon the Missionary service was presided over by Rev. W. W. Way.

The Newville Engine House will be completed in the Spring. Messrs. Byron and Lewis have purchased a house and lot on Catherine street from Mr. W. H. Bard. The New Haven Railroad has applied for the appointment of a building committee.

The Episcopal Church services are well attended. The Rev. Dr. Forbes has made a profound impression on his parishioners. The Catholic church is steadily increasing in number and the work is being prosecuted in spite of inclement weather.
