[The abstract of the Acts of Assembly Continued.]

*Abstract of an Act for defraying the common and necessary Charge of the Mannor of Cortland in the County of Westchester.*

**B**E it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Freeholders of the Mannor of Cortland, to elect and choose, yearly and every year, *One Supervisor, One Treasurer, Two Assessors, and One Collector,* for the said Mannor who shall have the same Power, and do, perform, and serve, and be liable to the same Pains and Penalties as the Supervisors, Treasurers, Assessors and Collectors of the respective Counties within this Colony have, and be liable to. And whereas the Act, entitled, *An Act for regulating the Choice of a Representative for the Mannor of Cortland,* it is among other Things provided, *That the Freeholders and Inhabitants of the said Mannor of Cortland shall pay the Wage, of their own Representative, and that nothing therein contained shall exempt them from paying their equal Proportion of the Wages of the Representatives for the County of Westchester, and of all other the annual publick and necessary Charges of the same County;* Be it enacted, That every Clause, and Article in the said Proviso is hereby repealed except the following Words; *viz. (And of all other the annual, publick and necessary Charges of the same County. And be it enacted, That the Wages and Charge of the Representative for the said Mannor, in general Assembly, shall be Six Shillings for every Day he attends the Service of the said Assembly; and the Freeholders and Inhabitants of the said Mannor shall only pay the Wages of their own Representative, and no other.*

*Abstract of an Act to divide Dutchess County into Precincts, and to repeal the Act therein mentioned.*

**B**E it Enacted, That from and after the Publication of this Act the said County shall be divided into seven Precincts in the following Manner.

The South Precinct to contain all that Part of the High Lands which is granted by Patent to Adolph Philipse, Esq;

The Rombout or Fishkill Precinct to contain all that Part granted to Rombout and Company that lieth to the South and Southeast-ward of Wappinger's Kill or Creek.

Beckman Precinct to contain all that Land granted to Col. Henry Beckman, deceased, lying to the Rear of the Patent granted to Francis Rombout and Company.

Poughkeepsie Precinct to contain all the Lands to the Northwest of the Wappinger's Kill or Creek from the Mouth thereof and up along the said Kill or Creek and Hudson's River until it meets the Patent granted to Heathcoat and Company, called *The lower nine Partners.*

Cromelbow Precinct to contain all the Lands granted to the said Heathcoat and Company, called *The lower nine Partners;* and all the Land granted to Peter Fancouier and Company in *Pauling's Purchase,* and as far to the North ward as a due East Line run from the North End of *Little Esopus Island* to the *Cromelbow Kill* or Creek.

Kymbeck Precinct to contain all the Lands purchas'd of the Widdow Pauling and her Children, by Doctor Samuel Staats, deceased, all the Land granted to *Adriaen Rosa* and Company, that Land patented by Col. Henry Beckman, deceased, and the Lands granted by Patent to Coll. Peter Schuiler, called *Magdalen's Island Purchase.*

The Northeast Precinct to contain all the Lands granted to *Samson Broseghson* and Company, commonly called *The upper nine Partners.*

Be it enacted, That the Inhabitants of every respective Precinct are hereby authorized yearly and every Year, upon the first Tuesday in April, to elect and appoint one Freeholder to be a Supervisor, two Assessors, and one Collector in every Precinct in the said County, who shall have the same Power to perform, and serve, and be liable to the same Pains and Penalties as the Supervisors, Assessors and Collectors of the several Counties within this Colony have, or ought to do. And the Wages or Reward for the several Supervisors within the said County shall be paid by the Freeholders and Inhabitants of each Precinct respectively, and their annual Meeting be on every first Tuesday in February, at Poughkeepsie; and that the Wages of each Supervisor shall not exceed Three Shillings for each Day.
