## Five Are Hospitalized Following Three-Car Accident Last Night

Seven area persons were injured, with five being hospitalized, as result of a three-car crash Wednesday evening on Rt. 17 near Little Genesee. Wellsville-based State Police listed the operators of the vehicles as James Leonard of Ceres, Grace Bergman of Bolivar and Walter Robbins of Little Genesee.

Mr. Leonard and Mrs. Bergman were both taken to Olean General Hospital where they were listed as "fairly good". He sustained lacerations and possible internal injuries, and she is suffering from possible fractured ribs and lacerations.

St. Francis Hospital officials termed Mr. Robbins' condition "good." He sustained fractured ribs.

Miss Sharon Lewis of Little Genesee, passenger in the Leonard auto, is in "fair" condition at Olean General where she is being treated for abdominal injuries. She and Mr. Leonard were to have been married this Saturday at the Bolivar Methodist Church.

Passengers in the Bergman auto were Eric Bergman, 16, discharged from Olean General and treated by a private physician for lacerations of the scalp; Debbie Bergman, 10, being treated for contusions at Olean General, listed as "fairly good"; and Dawn Bergman, 3, treated for abrasions and released.

Troopers said the Robbins auto, headed east on Rt. 17, crossed over to the westbound lane, sidswiped the Leonard auto and then hit the Bergman car, which was also proceeding west, in the left front. The accident occurred about 9:40 p.m., one and nine-tenths miles east of Ceres, near the Colliseum. Troopers are continuing their investigation.

Supervising Principal George Kuhn is to present awards, and scholarship winners will receive certificates from Gilbert Brinnier, senior high principal.

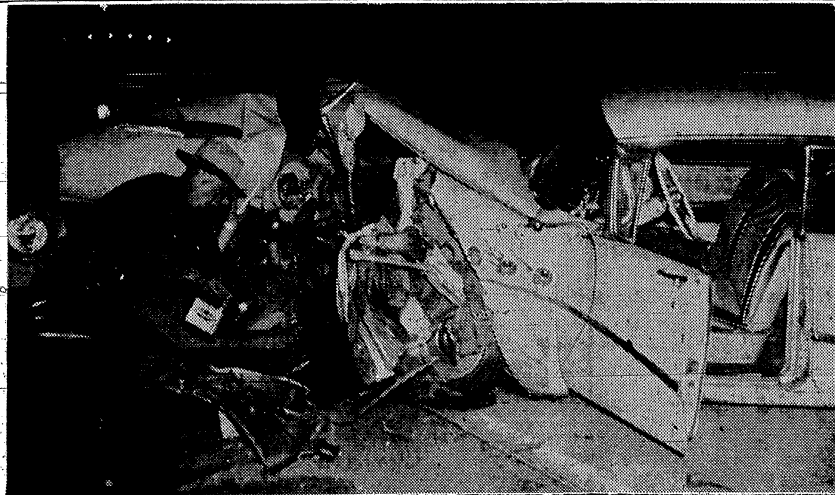
