Win Prizes in Fox Trapping Competition

Two Bolivar boys and a Richburg lad were among the nine from Allegany County honored last week for fox-trapping efforts. The eight-week trapping contest was climaxed by a dinner at the Scio Community Building, attended by approximately 75 boys, parents and sportsmen.

Local winners, the number of foxes they caught, and their cash prizes were: **Mark Lord** of Bolivar, 17, \$30; **Douglas Moore**, Bolivar, six, \$20; and **Robert Dunbar**, Richburg, five, \$15. A total of 79 foxes were turned in for award computation, compared with 66 in 1964 and 56 in 1963.

Contest is sponsored jointly by the Allegany County Sportsmen's Federation, the Allegany County Board of Supervisors and the Allegany County 4-H Club Department.

The 4-H Department assumed the responsibility for teaching the 175 boys who signed up for the competition. The Federation distributed the scent and traps, and the supervisors contributed money for prizes and the dinner.

Interest in the program is due to a desire to control possible outbreaks in rabies, carried by foxes, within the county. A total of \$170 in cash prizes was awarded.

The new director was graduated from Bolivar Central School, and from Cornell University in 1931. He attended Cornell Law School, and engaged in oil production for about 25 years. He served as materials control supervisor at **Daystrom Furniture** for 18 years. At present, he is serving with the Small Business Administration in its SCORE program which involves utilizing services of retired executives to aid small business.
