

## Australia Fruit Growers Look To American Markets

WASHINGTON (AP) — Fears of higher shipping costs for sending produce to the European market are causing Australia fruit growers to look more expectantly at U.S. consumers as potential buyers of apples and pears, the Agriculture Department said today.

Australian apple production was a record 23.5 million bushels this year, and although pear output—at 8.2 million bushels—was down from the previous season it still was the second largest crop on record, the Foreign Agricultural Service said.

"Growers are worried, however, because their traditional export markets in Western Europe and the United Kingdom are weakening and are expected to decline even further when the U.K. enters the European Community," the report said.

Also, the FAS said, growers are worried about proposed increases in shipping costs, estimated to boost charges by 25 per cent.

Thus, the report added, Australia growers are looking around for opportunities to expand other markets. Apple shipments to the United States already are substantial, about 345,000 bushels this year, and pears for the American market totaled 485,000 bushels.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department says an annual income tax educational program sponsored by the Extension Service has extended far beyond those it immediately touches.

Extension officials in the states set up the program for fall and winter months for farmers and professional tax con-

sultants. Surveys show 20 states conducted schools and workshops last year, with an attendance of 13,065 persons.

Those in turn were estimated to have prepared about 800,000 tax returns for farmers.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Broiler chickens and potatoes head the Agriculture Department's "plentiful foods" list for December. Other items in seasonal abundance for the holiday

season include apples, rice, fresh pears, cranberries, pork, turkey and eggs.

The list is published each month to help call consumer attention to farm products in extra supply at food stores.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Production of red clover seed this year is expected to total 44.4 million pounds, down 10 per cent from 1970 despite a sharp increase in Illinois, the leading producer.

Clover acreage nationally was down in

1971 by 14 per cent, according to the Agriculture Department. Illinois reported 78,000 acres for seed harvest, compared with 81,000 last year.

However, Illinois yields went up, averaging 90 pounds per acre, compared with 80 in 1970. That meant total production increased in the state to more than seven million pounds, compared with less than 6.5 million in 1970, officials said.

And the horse and wagon licenses doubled from 1970 to this year's total of two.
