Sooners' Ground Game Stops Pesky Missouri

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — Second-ranked Oklahoma resorted mostly to short-yardage rushes Saturday, but came up with two long runs and Jack Mildren's 44-yard pass to Albert Chandler for a 20-8 Big Eight Conference victory over Missouri.

Linebacker Mark Driscoll grabbed Greg Hill's blocked 28-yard field goal attempt and rumbled 78 yards for a first period touchdown.

After Hill's 34-yard field goal cut the margin to 6-3, Roy Bell broke through Missouri's tough defense and raced 78 yards for two scrimmage plays later.

Mildren, who in previous games had been extremely successful with the wishbone triple option, turned mostly to straight-ahead power plays with Leon Crosswhite, Greg Pruitt and Bell slamming into the line time after time.

Once during the second period, Oklahoma marched 83 yards on 19 plays, but couldn't get the final two yards on a keep by Mildren, who fumbled and Steve Mizer recovered on the 1 for Missouri.

Blue Devil Defense Plays Best Game Of The Season

A second half gamble by OFA backfired as the Sandstoners blanked OFA, 14-0 Saturday. The victory gave Potsdam the Northern League championship and their first unbeaten season ever.

For the OFA defense it was their finest performance of the season. OFA elected to kickoff against Potsdam to start the second half. "We felt that we could contain the Sandstoners with our defense and maybe get the ball deep in their territory," said Coach Brian Wade.

However Dave Piel connected to Lyle Rowe for a 54 yard touchdown pass. Rowe had beaten his man Bob Seymour and Piel hit him right on the target. The OFA defense played hard but the offense, after showing some signs of life in the second quarter, failed to move in the second half.

Potsdam's ball control game allowed OFA only 10 plays from scrimmage in the second half.

An elated Mike Loconti said of his Saturday foes, "They had to be the toughest defensive team we've played all year. They really hit hard."

Pete Ives ended the first Potsdam threat as he intercepted a Piel pass in the end zone. The invaders ran 21 plays to OFA's 4 in the first quarter.

They took the ball on their own 20 and marched 60 yard before the interception.

The Blue Devils were forced to punt after their first series of downs.

After an exchange of punts OFA moved to their own 48 yard line after an end around play with John Robinson hitting end Tom Marlow for the lone gainer. On the previous play Robinson was dumped on the end around.

A fumble gave the ball back to the Sandstoners, but two plays later Jay Farrand recovered.

It was here that the Blue Devils mounted their only serious drive of the day. The drive ended when Paul McDonald faked a punt inside the Potsdam 40 and handed off to Jerry Richards. Richards ran to the Potsdam 31 but short of the first down.

Dave Romola nearly broke a tackle but was hauled down to OFA's 45 yard line. Pete Nicola then hauled in a Piel Pass at the OFA 26 yard line. Larry Langley busted through the Potsdam line to throw Piel for a loss back to the Blue Devil 30 yard line. The Potsdam drive on the 20 yard line.

Potsdam got the second half kickoff and on a third down pass play Piel found Rowe who had gotten in behind his man and scored the first touchdown.

OFA Freshmen Blank Potsdam

Andy Morley fired two touchdown passes - one to Mike Sargent and another to Bob Premo.

Georgia Whips Florida, 49-7

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — The seventh-ranked Georgia Bulldogs methodically hammered out their ninth straight football victory Saturday, using a relentless ground attack and pivotal defensive plays by Buzy Rosenberg and Mixon Robinson to overcome helpless Florida 49-7.

Rosenberg returned a punt 36 yards to set up one touchdown and Robinson rambled 38 yards to score after picking off a pass.

These two plays put the Bulldogs on the right track after a bumbling start and gave them a comfortable 20-7 halftime lead.

St. Lawrence Tops RPI

Canton - St. Lawrence University's defensive unit posted its second straight shutout to pace the Larries to a 10-0 football win over RPI on Saturday afternoon.

The season ending was the fifth of the campaign for the Larries against three losses. RPI is now 3 - 5 with one game to play against Hobart.

SLU powerful defense held RPI to only 16 yards rushing in the game. The Larries intercepted 2 RPI passes and recovered four of the engineers' fumbles.

The Larries' defensive unit held Rochester scoreless in a 35-0 win. St. Lawrence gained 182 yards rushing with halfback Barry Dutter, the game leader, with 86 yards in 23 carries.

Larrie Coach Ted Stratford has now compiled a 16 and 8 winning record in three seasons at St. Lawrence.

Vermont Nips Maine, 17-13

BURLINGTON, Vt. (AP) — A 25-yard run by fullback Steve Coon with five minutes to play gave the University of Vermont a 17-13 Yankee Conference football victory over Maine Saturday.

The winning touchdown came on a three-play, 83-yard drive. Coon's seventh touchdown of the season climaxed a come-from-behind victory after Maine had taken a 13-10 lead with six and a half minutes left to play.

Jim Hayes scored Maine's go-ahead touchdown on a one-yard plunge.

After Piel scored from three yards out Potsdam got the ball right back on the kickoff. The kick by Sweet traveled only 20 yards and OFA couldn't catch the spinning ball and Potsdam recovered.
