**Potsdam's Swim Team Set For New Season, Open Dec. 4**

POTSDAM - The water in the Merritt Hall pool is being whipped into foam each afternoon now as the Potsdam State varsity swimming team practices for the fast-approaching 1971-72 season. New swimming coach Dave Allen, seeing the team for the first time, has said "This year's team looks promising, considering this is only the fourth year Potsdam has had a team." Noting that he'll know more when he has seen his team in competition, Coach Allen said he felt the team looks "fairly good" with most of last year's swimmers returning and some promising freshmen. Captained this year by butterflyer and freestyler Morris Spitzer, a senior from Yonkers, and junior Jack McAllister of Niagara Falls, who competes in the butterfly, backstroke and individual medley events, the team is striving to improve on last season's performance which placed the team seventh in the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) swimming and diving championships. Returning lettermen who will aid in this effort are seniors Dennis Fitch and Frank Woodley, junior Chris Utz; and sophomores Ron Koithan, Dick Sperry and Brian Stickney. Freshmen who have looked promising include Mark Henderson, Steve Fay and Rich Karr. The swimming Bears will open their 1971-72 season with the Plattsburgh Relays at Plattsburgh Dec. 4 and face their first dual meet competition at Oswego State Dec. 8. In all, there are 10 meets, three of which are triangular, on the Potsdam schedule prior to the SUNYAC championships March 3. **Fish Clean Up Badly Polluted Lake**

VIENNA (AP) - Vienna's city fathers say the "Old Danube," a 1.5 square kilometer lake which was badly polluted last year, is clean again and they credit a fish with doing most of the clean-up job. Some 1,000 Chinese grass fish—with the long-winded Greek-Latin name "Czephyrargoden. Tdella"—were placed into the "Old Danube" after Viennese feared their favorite recreation spot might have to be closed down because of increasing pollution. The fish generally are known as "White Amur," after the border river between the Soviet Union and Communist China, and where they reportedly originate. They were already valued in Hungary and Russia as weed killers, and imported to Austria from Hungary. Pollution of the "Old Danube" was caused by a large water fowl population and humans who neglected sanitary measures, causing the lake's weeds to grow by leaps and bounds. One of the first moves was to have the water birds shooed away, humans were ordered to comply with sanitary regulations, and the fish started to devour the weeds. They eat nothing but vegetables. To gain one kilogram of weight they need approximately 60 to 80 kilos of vegetables. When they were set out in the "Old Danube" they weighed about a quarter of a kilogram and now some tip the scales at 2.5 kilos. After acclimatization they were first tried out in a small, weed-invested pond in Styria province. After one season, the fish had eaten all the weeds and consequently had to be fed with land-grown weeds. Acclimatization posed the biggest problem. The city's press office explained that Austrian waters in summer were colder than the Amur river and thus the fish refused to produce any offspring. After hormone treatment and a reasonable acclimatization period they finally began to multiply.

**School Unions Plan For Merger Talks**

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) - The New York State Teachers Association and the United Teachers of New York State, AFL-CIO, the two rival teachers unions in the state, will conduct merger talks beginning Nov. 30, the leaders of both groups announced today. The announcement was made in a joint statement issued by NYSTA President Thomas V. Hobart and UTNY President Albert Shanker. Shanker, whose New York City-based union formerly was called the United Federation of Teachers, made the original overtures for the possible merger, culminating in a news conference last Monday. Before ending a three-day convention in Syracuse last Tuesday, NYSTA delegates approved a general resolution "to continue and expand discussion leading to a possible merger of all teachers in New York State into one organization." The location of the talks will be announced later, the statement said. NYSTA represents about 105,000 teachers, mostly in upstate areas, while Shanker's new union claims a membership of 90,000. The New York City UTNY local alone has 55,000 members. Former NYSTA President Emanuel Kafka conducted preliminary, exploratory merger talks with Shanker in August, but Kafka said at the opening of the NYSTA conference last week that "our members by and large are not prepared to join the AFL-CIO and Shanker is not strong enough to leave it."
