

CLINTON COUNTY HERD HAS ENVIABLE RECORD

averaging 891 pounds of milk, 37.05 pounds of butterfat in June, the Crest Bourn herd of purebred Ayrshires owned by Ralph B. Dodds, of Plainfield, again ranked fifth among the leading producing herds in the United States, tested under the rules of the Ayrshire Herd Book, according to Advanced Registry Supt. W. A. Kyle, of the Ayrshire Breeder's Association, of London, Vt.

Mr. Dodds' herd has completed two years' work in the Clinton County Dairy Improvement Association ranking the highest of all herds tested, with the excellent average of 9,276 pounds of milk and 388.67 pounds of butterfat in the first year, and 9,771 pounds of milk and 381.96 pounds of butterfat in the second year, which entitles the herd to a National Honor Roll certificate issued by the National Dairy Association.

During the past twelve months the herd has topped the list of herds tested for butterfat production for nine months, ranking second and third two other months, also the highest individual cow for five months of the year, one good cow in the herd having produced 2,241 pounds of milk 81.4 pounds of butterfat in one month.

In the month of May Mr. Dodds had high cow for milk and butterfat production, and twelve of the thirteen cows milking, fifty per cent of which are heifers, were on the Honor Roll.

Some of the splendid records made during the past year are 14,437 pounds milk, 567 pounds butterfat by a senior four year old, also 12,011 pounds milk, 477 pounds butterfat, 11,781 pounds milk, 523 pounds butterfat and 10,748 pounds milk and 416 pounds of butterfat by three other good cows.

These cows have good type as well as production, having won honors at the Clinton County Fair. Professor Wallace of the Chazy Rural School has visited the farm several times with a class of boys for lessons in judging dairy cattle. Cows from this herd have been sold for shipment to Ayrshire herds in Southern and Western New York State, also Vermont, Massachusetts and Connecticut.

Ash Grove Silk Socks, a son of the great show bull, Alta-Crest Ting-a-Ling, a junior champion at the National Dairy show in 1923, heads the herd. His dam, the great producing cow, Mistress Silk of South Farm has a two year old record of 9,000 pounds of milk.

This is really an enviable record and Mr. Dodds is being congratulated on the splendid progress his herd has made toward the advancement of the breed.

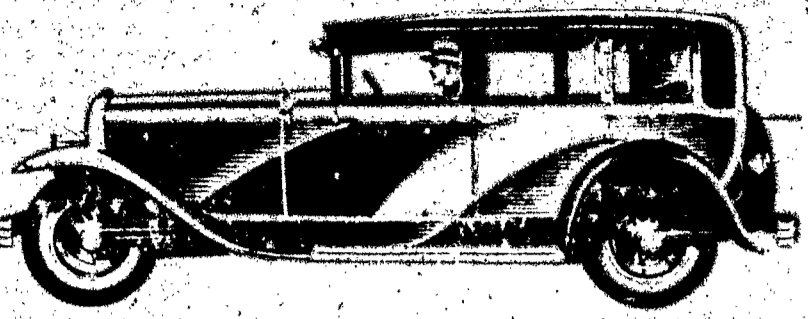
