

ACTIVITIES IN CHAMPLAIN VALLEY

Scout Executive reported annual supper meeting of Champlain Valley Council that in the past six months, sixteen troops of Scouts had been organized in the territory comprised by Champlain in Clinton and Essex counties. Special rallies have been held by the following troops during the past week. Troop No. 42 of Ticonderoga, Troop No. 2 of Champlain and Troop No. 17 of Plattsburgh.

Thursday evening, Nov. 22, Plattsburgh troop No. 17 under direction of Mr. Dwight Beech, Deputy Commissioner, and Walter B. Goodale, Scoutmaster and Tom Minard, Assistant Scoutmaster, a "Dad and Son" supper was served at the Y. M. C. A. The supper was served by the mothers of the Scouts. It was a most enjoyable occasion with music, stunts and demonstrations by the members of the troop and the presentation of two Star Scout Badges by Mr. W. D. Macbride. The new Scout Executive, Mr. H. Rogers, addressed the fathers on "The Fun and Responsibility in Scouting."

On the same date, the Champlain troop held a special investigation service for their first three class, and first four second class Scout awards. Members of the troop, Troop Committee and two Executives were guests on the occasion.

A number of boys are taking air tenderfoot tests in Port Henry, getting ready for the initiation ceremony for the new troop, which will be under the direction of Scoutmaster Allen H. Bert and Assistant Scoutmaster Kenneth Hausner. The troop No. 17 of Ticonderoga with Scoutmaster Dr. K. J. Bowers will be the hosts of the Port Henry Troop at the ceremony.

The second Scoutleader's Training Course has been started at Ticonderoga and the next meeting will be held Dec. 5th. This course is open to Scoutmasters, leaders, committeemen and any one interested in learning about Scouting. The third section of the training course will probably start on Dec. 12 at Plattsburgh for both elementary and approved courses.

On Tuesday evening, Nov. 27th the Executive Committee of the Council meets in Plattsburgh with the newly elected officer and chairman to plan for the new year's program. The meeting will be held at the Scout Headquarters, City Hall, Plattsburgh.

TRAPPING SEASON IN FULL SWING

Sunday of last week marked the opening of the legal trapping season for mink, skunk, raccoon, sable or marten. The conservation law reads that pink sable or marten may be taken from November 15 to March 15 in any manner, day or night, but the open season for skunk and raccoon extends only from November 10 to February 10. Raccoon may be taken day or night in any manner, except by taking out of dens or houses or by cutting down trees. The conservation law also specifies that skunks must not be hunted, pursued or killed by dogs and that holes or taken by the use of chemicals or by smoking.

Many trappers report that prospects are favorable for a profitable season, although it is thought that the lack of cold weather may have retarded the priming of the fur. The past month has been somewhat warmer than usual but there have been a few cold snaps.

The rural trapper will concentrate on the mink, mink and raccoon, all three of these fur bearers being abundant in any trapping section. The habitat of the marten or sable, however, is in the higher regions and they are usually found in big timber.

The season for the legal taking of muskrats does not open until December 1.
