AUSTRIA TO OCCUPY BOSNIA.—THE IRISH AHEAD IN THE SHOOTING MATCH FOR THE ELCHO SHIELD.—ENGLISH MAN-OF-WAR FIRED UPON.

LONDON, July 18.—Many members of the Cabinet are opposed to a general election, but the Premier strongly favors it.

The Common Council of London to-day unanimously resolved to bring forward a motion that Beaconsfield and Salisbury be invited to a banquet, and be presented the freedom of the city.

The shooting for the Elcho challenge shield in the 900 yard range at the Wimbledon meeting resulted as follows:—Ireland, 535; Scotland, 523; England, 521. The light was very bad for long range.

The Times Constantinople special says that the captain of an English steamer reports that he was stopped off Gallipoli by a signal from the English fleet directing him to take on board a lieutenant sent by the Admiral to report the following:

Two days ago a man-of-war boat was cruising off the Russian lines. The crew, on landing, were immediately made prisoners. The Lieutenant, Midshipman and ten men in the boat, not returning to the English fleet, another boat was sent to look for them, but upon approaching the place this boat was fired upon, two bullets passing through the sides of the boat without doing injury.

Beaconsfield will visit the Queen at Osborne, Saturday. He was not well enough to go to Windsor, yesterday, but Salisbury went.

Paris, July 18.—The strike at Auzin is one of the most extensive ever known in France. Five thousand and colliers left the pits, demanding higher wages, and that eight hours should be a day's work. There are the usual rumors afloat of foreign instigators and Bonapartist intrigues. The gen d'armes have had to protect the pits to prevent the agitators from seizing them and stopping any still at work. A number of arrests have been made. Troops have been brought up and public houses closed.

VIENNA, July 18.—The occupation of Bosnia by Austria will commence about August 1st. Gen. Philippovick will proceed hence to Eszek where the movement of the army are to be directed. He expects to reach Serejeva, Bosnia, August 18th, the Emperor Francis Joseph's birthday.
