"The wife of Minister Noyes," Mrs. Lucy Hooper writes to the Philadelphia Telegraph, "is much benefited in health by her sojourn at the German baths. THE Pan-Presbyterian council met at Philadelphia yesterday and will continue, with daily sessions, until the close of next week. They were Francis McKenzie, an Irishman, and John Hampton, a Scotchman, who settled on the eastern shore of Virginia, near the Maryland border.

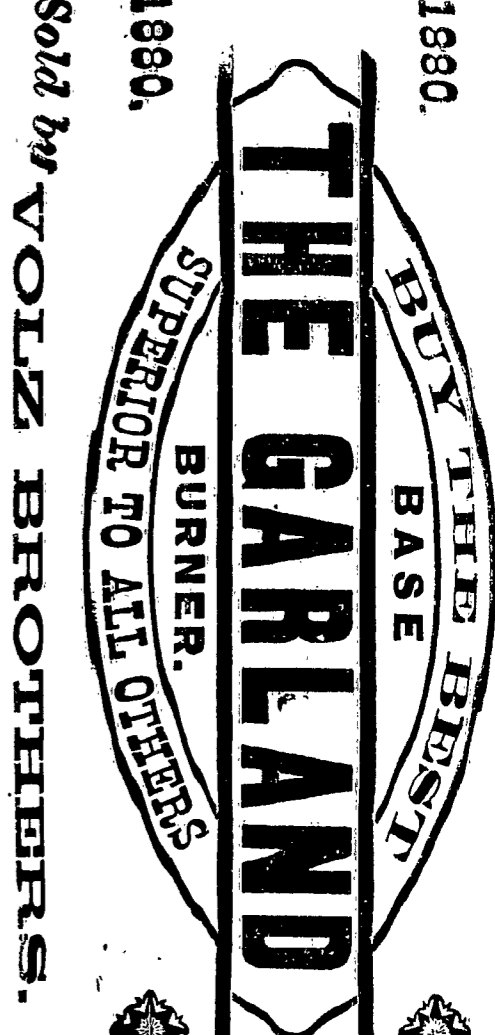
