THE NEXT census of the German empire will be taken on the 1st of December next. It is estimated that the returns, when made up, will show an increase of from 5 to 10 per cent. in the population. At the last enumeration, in 1875, the German nation was found to number 42 3/4 million souls. The kingdom of Prussia, with a population of about 25 3/4 millions, possess nine universities in almost all but the name. In these eleven institutions, including the universities of Berlin, Breslau, Gottingen, Bonn, Hall, Konigsberg, Greitswald, Marburg and Kiel, the academy of Munster and the Lyceum of Braunsberg, there was a staff of professors and lecturers numbering altogether 985, while their auditors exceeded 10,000 in number, the matriculated students alone being 9,663 strong in the last summer session. Berlin remains by far the most frequented of all the Prussian, and, indeed, of all the German universities.

The annual boat race between Harvard and Yale has grown to be quite a costly affair. The Treasurer of the Harvard University Boat Club has just reported that the year's expenses were \$4,428.65, and that the club is in debt \$404 at that. The amount of money consumed, however, in preparing for the race, is a trifle compared with the time. Both Harvard and Yale have already begun their work for next summer's regatta.

A Determined Suicide.
Major Raffelle Piccoli, a volunteer "of the thousand," and one of the heroes of Garibaldi's famous Sicilian expedition, has recently laid hands on his life in a wholly unprecedented manner at Catanzaco, where he had been for some years past residing with his wife and five children. The Piccoli family had long suffered extreme poverty, its entire income consisting of three hundred lire—about twelve pounds—granted to the major by the Italian government in recognition of his splendid services in 1860. It appears that this unfortunate warrior and patriot, weary of the hopeless struggle against the direst want, determined to put an end to his troubles by suicide. Having carefully sharpened a large nail he shut himself up one day in his bedroom and proceeded to carry out his desperate resolve. He wrapped up a heavy stone in rags, so that his children in the adjoining chamber might not hear the noise of hammering, and setting the point of the nail against his temple, drove it in up to the head without uttering a single cry or groan. When his wife casually entered the bedroom some time afterward she found Piccoli a corpse, stretched out upon the floor, with a picture of the Virgin on his breast and the fatal stone tightly grasped in his right hand. Great public sympathy has been awakened in Italy by the melancholy fate of this gallant Garibaldian.

Making Room for the Mourners.

Some years ago, among the Berkshire Hills, in Massachusetts, there was a funeral. The woman who mingled curiosity with pity was there with the mourners. To the afflicted widow, in a melancholy voice, she said:
"When did you get your new eight-day clock?"
"I ain't got no new eight-day clock," responded the bereaved woman.
"Why, what is that in the corner? Ain't that an eight-day clock? persisted the curious visitor.
"No; that ain't a clock, that is the deceased. We stood it on end in the corner to make room for the mourners."
