Victories by Sweden's Ingemar Johansson, Argentina's Alex Miteff and Germany's Willi Besmanoff in the past few weeks resulted today in a reshuffling of the lower half of the division's rankings by Ring Magazine.

Johansson, undefeated European Heavyweight champion from Sweden, was named "Fighter of the Month" and advanced from 10th to seventh place for his 13-round technical knockout of Welshman Joe Erskine, the British Empire champ.
