Sayville Historical Society 2nd Annual House Tour

The Sayville Historical Society will host its second annual House Tour on Sunday, December 18th from 2 to 5 pm. Spurred on by last year's success and fun, this year showcases six different homes in Sayville and West Sayville.

The oldest continuously lived-in house is in West Sayville. Built in 1840, it is a typical Dutch bayman's cottage with hand-hewn rafters.

Another, an Isaac Green house, was built in 1893 for Henry Shattuck and his wife, Josephine Terry of Sayville. It features, as always, Mr. Green's wonderful woodwork and moldings.

Three are examples of 20th century design. One gem of a house is beautifully decorated by its present owners. Another is part of the "Country Club Estates," the community visited a year ago. The third, where refreshments will be served, was built as an annex to the Delevan Hotel.

Last, but hardly least, is the illustrated home. It's a dream anytime of the year, but especially at Christmas.
