"That's What's the Matter."

Our city contemporaries continue to discuss the subject of the recent judicial election, giving diverse reasons, according to their respective gifts of prophecy, why it resulted as it did.

But what the cause of this apathy and why the frauds were not prevented, we have not been told.

But to return, to mention at least one cause of Republican apathy. It is the foreknowledge they have of Democratic frauds. It has come to be understood that whatever majority may be rolled up in the rural districts for the Republican cause and candidates, that it will be overcome in the city of New York by means.

As yet, these fraudulent practices are looked upon with favor by the great majority of those voting the same ticket; only a few men of that party, more thoughtful than the rest, now see the cloud no larger than a man's hand, that will spread over and blacken the whole canopy of heaven, breaking at last over our dejected heads and deluging the land in blood.

Republican voters are good fighters, but they shrink from perjury and fraud. By these we have been beaten three successive times, and is it any wonder that the Republicans of the rural districts have become somewhat apathetic about attending elections?

We have not met with a more rational and lucid statement of the judgment of the people on the action of Congress than the following extract from an editorial of two N. Y. Times of a recent date contains.

Electors this Fall will turn less upon the freedom than upon the tariff—less upon the war than upon taxation—less upon occurrences that are over, than upon the will and the honesty to introduce more economy, more honesty, more efficiency into the various departments of Government.
