## THREATENS LIFE OF GIRL, CHARGE AGAINST YOUTH

## BAR ASS'N VOTES TO UPHOLD LAW

Lawyers Take Steps to Stop Practice of Unauthorized Persons

A resolution to effect stopping of unauthorized persons drawing up legal papers was passed at the last meeting of the Richmond County Bar Association.

The resolution calls for the attention of notaries public, real estate agents, loan brokers and all lawyers to the section of the state statute and a decision of the New York court of Appeals forbidding anyone except a licensed lawyer, or in any way practicing law.

Considerable trouble has been caused in the past by this practice and steps will be taken to prevent the same. The Richmond County Bar will co-operate with the state body in the enforcement of this statute.

Under the state law anyone unauthorized, doing this work is guilty of a misdemeanor and liable to \$500 fine, or one year imprisonment, or both.
