Washington Topics.

Gen. Hazen, chief signal officer, has recommended to the President that Sgt. Brainard, who was with Lieut. Greely in the Arctic regions, be appointed to a lieutenantcy.

An experienced postoffice department official says he thinks the postmaster-general will in his annual report to congress recommend an universal postage of a cent for letters and newspapers.

Postoffice inspectors have discovered a shortage in money-order funds of \$15,45, and in postal funds of \$114,39, in the accounts of the postmaster at Potsdam, and he has been recommended for suspension.

Malcolm Hay tendered his resignation as first Assistant Postmaster General, on account of illness. It was accepted by the President and ex-Congressman A. B. Stevenson, of Illinois, was appointed his successor.

A Washington despatch says it is understood William E. Smith, of Plattsburgh, has been named to the President's desire not to accept any office of the duties which will require him to go to Washington.

The President on Monday appointed postmasters in eight cities to fill vacancies occurring by expirations of commissions and resignations. Thirty-nine cases for removal were considered. Among these 22 suspensions were made and in 17 cases the alleged cause was not deemed sufficient.

The Washington Star says: "When Miss Sweet, the pension agent at Chicago, was asked to resign some months ago, she was told that she would have until the 30th of June to send in her resignation. It is said that no further steps will be taken in the matter, and that it is probable that Miss Sweet will serve out the remaining year of the term for which she was appointed."

Mexican States for Sale.

The financial condition of Mexico has resulted in many propositions for the sale of Mexican territory to this government.

It is stated that it is to have been discovered by the score on the President and Secretary Bayard touching upon this question, and making suggestions of varied import.

There is also a report that President Diaz has entrusted to a secret ambassador the making of overtures in this direction.

The most popular of the plans pushed forward in one for the purchase of the six states of Mexico which lie on the northern boundary next to the United States: Tamaulipas, Nuevo Leon, Coahuila, Chihuahua, Sonora, and Lower California.

A second scheme provided for the sale of Sonora, Chihuahua and Lower California only still a third project is being pushed on by the attention of the administration by the American projectors of the Trans-Pacific railroad company.

It is for the acquisition of a strip of land 20 miles wide across the isthmus of Isthmus and enough at Cape Catoche, Yucatan, for the construction of a line. It is thought this could be obtained for \$20,000,000 or \$1,000,000 for such a strip a mile wide and 1430 miles long.

Extensive cases in a Delaware and Hudson Mine.
