## DR. F. C. KELLY ON CATHOLIC EXTENSION

OUTLINED THE ORGANIZATION OF THE LIFE THROUGH 8 YEARS, AND ITS GREAT FUTURE AT ST. AGNES' CHURCH

At the 10:30 A. M. mass held at St. Agnes' Church last Sunday the preacher was Rev. Francis Cogan, D. D., president of the Catholic Extension Society. Father Kelly was chairman in the Irish language, and is a lecturer of wide note. He confined his remarks Sunday to outlining the foundation of the organization and its mission. He stated that the society was started eight years ago when he was elected president.

The object of the Extension Society is to provide suitable houses of worship and pastors for the districts that are far removed from metropolitan centers. Some of these missio- nary priests have no communities, and over a wide territory, which the laityman has got to traverse either by driving or riding horseback.

He referred to the great work he accomplished by the Chicago and the Automobile Chapel. The latter is fitted out with altar, stained glass and sink, and is in the process, and St. Patrick's, New York, and St. Peter's, New York, are similar in plan.

The speaker said you might ask "Where does the money come from?" He said "I do not know. The day after tomorrow a new money market is being organized in the town of Lake Placid. It is a movement to get in a check of \$1,000,000 from year to year, and to be at the end of eight years of its existence eight hundred churches, and so on, have been built."

He stated that the organization is conducted on strictly business principles, and appeals to the business men of this country. There are regularly paid officers, board of directors, etc. Stagnant communities, where houses of worship, if able to raise \$500, the Extension Society will loan them \$1,000 without interest.

The society also publishes a magazine, which has a wide circulation, and while it is not a source of revenue, Father Kelly said that it aided in getting the work of the Extension Society before the public.

## ESCAPED OCEAN DEATH TO DROWN IN LAKE

Adam Sognart, who was a passenger on the Titanic at the time of the disaster, and who was one of the survivors by being taken to shore in a lifeboat, was drowned, it seems, to a watery grave, and met his death on June 23, while bathing in Lake Placid. Mr. Sognart, a native of Sweden, was 40 years of age, single, and unable to swim. He was in the lake with his wife and three children, when he fell in. He was seen by a neighbor, who called to him, but he could not reach him.

## ZANE MARTIN'S HOUSE BURNED TO GROUND

Fire destroyed the house of Zane Martin, which is in the Smith and Murray mill yard on Monday at noon. Mrs. Martin smelted smoke in the house and upon investigation discovered smoke pouring into the house from the chimney. She called to some neighbors, who assisted her in the work of removing the furniture.

## MARIE TYRELL IN CRITICAL CONDITION

LIGHTED POWDER AND SLOTHFULLY BURNED WHEN CLOTHES CAUGHT FIRE—MOTHER BURNED ALSO

Several years ago the approach of the fourth of July suggested many thoughtful and anxious thoughts to the mother, who sought a scheme to keep her little ones away from the noise and glare of the dangerous fireworks which formerly proved the predominant feature of this occasion.

Now we read of the sudden and fearful change which made the fourth a day of happiness and sorrow, where the introduction of dramatic events, etc. have practically put out of the celebration via powder and noise.

However, accidents will happen to some extent, and in the case this year, Marie Tyrell, 10 years of age, and her mother, Mrs. J. C. Purcell, of Chicago, cut of Lake Mirror at 10:30 this (Friday) morning. This was the first rescue for McKeon this season.

Marie Tyrell and her mother were playing on the boat house dock when suddenly, as they were pushing each other, the one girl slipped and fell into the water. Just as she was falling, she grasped the Purcell's, and both went into the water.

The one girl was fortunate, and fell close enough to the dock to be able to draw herself to safety, but had struck the water beyond reach of the dock.

No sooner had the two struck the water than McKeon was running for the spot. As he lived into the water the Purcell girl had already gone down twice and she was about to dis appear for the third time. McKeon's efforts were rewarded, and he lifted her above the surface to swim to safety.
