The British Official Press Bureau reports that the situation in France is "satisfactory," and that the counter-attacks on the British front have been beaten back with severe losse to the Germans.

Germany, by wireless, announces that the forts under bombardment south of Verdun have withdrawn their fire, and that the German forces are now engaged with fresh troops of the Allies brought in from the Meuse. The French forces, says the German statement, are making desperate ef-forts to flank the German right wing.

French official reports state that the movement to flank the German right is developing to the north, and London thinks full success for the Allies is near. The French right has etaken St. Mihiel, driving back the Germans who crossed the Meuse in that vicinity.

Berlin admits that heav fighting is in progress on the western end of the French battle line, but says no decisive result has been reached. Advancing Belgians have reoccu-

pied Malines, half way between Ant werp and Brussels. The bombard-ment of some forts southeast of Ant-werp by the Germans still continues Desperate attempts of four German army corps to cross the River Niemen near the East Prussian frontier, with the object of cutting the railroad to Warsaw, have so far failed, the Russians repulsing the invaders all along
