

TICONDEROGA PAPER CO. LOSES IN \$353,867 SUIT

Court of Appeals Grants Big Award to Montreal Group—Judgment: Filed in Essex County Clerk's Office

A judgment awarding McDougall & Cowans, Montreal bankers, \$353,867.22 against the Ticonderoga Pulp and Paper company was recently filed in the Essex county clerk's office at Elizabethtown.

That same day there was filed for record a satisfaction of that judgment, signed by Thomas B. Cotter, attorney for the bankers. The satisfaction indicated that the judgment, which was dated December 2, was paid the same day it was prepared.

Seven years ago litigation in this matter started in the Superior Court of Quebec. The facts in the case have just come to light. The litigation, it seems, went through to the highest court of appeals of Quebec province. There the bankers were successful, and judgment for the full amount of their claim was granted them with interest and costs to date.

The Ticonderoga company took the case to the Privy Council of England, which is the highest appellate court of the British Empire. Here the judgment in favor of the Montreal bankers was again affirmed.

About two years ago suit on that judgment was begun in the courts of New York state by Thomas B. Cotter, attorney for the Montreal group. The appellate division ruled for the full amount of the Canadian judgment. On taking the case to the Court of Appeals, the Ticonderoga company lost again. Thus this long-drawn out litigation came to an end.

Food to Be Provided for Game Birds

Berry-bearing trees and shrubs are to be grown and distributed free by the New York Development Association, Inc., from its own nursery for planting by sportsmen's clubs and others, to provide food for game birds on all large areas to be reforested in this state, according to an announcement just issued by George A. Lawyer, former Chief U. S. Game Warden, now managing director and second vice-president of the New York Development Association, Inc., which has its principal office at Watertown, N. Y.

The association's program contemplates the planting of a billion trees within the next fifteen years and the planting of one hundred million trees annually thereafter until the four million acres of idle waste lands in the state are reforested, and includes the planting of a liberal supply of berry-bearing trees and shrubs and hardwood trees, such as beech and maple, to furnish summer and winter food for the birds.
