

Historical Society to Host 'Old-Time Musical Americana'

Jim Kimball and Glenn McClure, historians and performers of nineteenth-century American rural music, will present a program of tunes and minstrel songs at the Lima Historical Society's Tennie Burton Museum on Memorial Day, Monday, 25 May 1987.

"Old-Time Musical Americana" will begin at 11:00 a.m., after the town parade, on the porch of the Museum at 1850 Rochester Street.

According to Kimball, who has taught the history of music at the State University of New York at Geneseo since 1973, he and McClure (a recent Geneseo graduate who majored in music) will play "typical small-town Upstate New York popular tunes from the nineteenth century." Most will be tunes (rather than singing songs), though the two will sing minstrel songs such as "Old Dan Tucker" and "Darling Nellie Gray," commonly sung in itinerant minstrel shows that traveled throughout the region between the late 1840s and 1910.

Kimball and McClure will play a variety of nineteenth-century instruments, including the fiddle, dulcimer, jew's harp, fife, pump organ, banjo, and bones. Though Kimball's set of bones is made of ebony, they were often sticks of wood, spoons, or even the rib bones of cows in the nineteenth century.

Among other tunes, Kimball and McClure will play "Arkansas Traveler," "The Opera Reel," "The Crooked-S," "A Soldier's Joy," and "The Devil's Dream." Kimball's research into the history of music in this region in newspapers, tune lists, diaries, and tune books has documented that these pieces were all performed often in this region. They will also play tunes composed by Lou Willey of Nunda in the 1980s, such as "The On-time Quadrille," and by Sidney Grannis of Leroy, who copyrighted his "Do They Miss Me at Home?" in 1854. Grannis was part of a traveling group called the Amphions, made up of Leroy and East Bloomfield

musicians, who performed through this area in the nineteenth century.

Kimball performs regularly at the Genesee Country Museum and at the Farmer's Museum in Cooperstown, New York. With others and with the Genesee String Band, he has played in more than twelve counties in the Western New York region.

The Tennie Burton Museum will be open after the town parade, sponsored by the Francis M. Dalton post of the American Legion. The men of the Lima Historical Society will sell hot dogs, lemonade, ice cream, and coffee during Kimball's and McClure's performance.

A native of Ohio, Kimball has been researching the music of rural Western New York State since joining the Genesee faculty. McClure, a member of the Genesee String Band, is a native of York, New York.

Rotary Works at Camp Haccamo
