

### Boat Safety Course Starting

New York State's new Young Boatman's Safety Course will be taught in Minerva Deland High School beginning Wednesday, May 9, at 7 p.m.

The course, sponsored by the Conservation Department's Division of Motor Boats, will be taught locally by Charles Kopp and Louis Bernard.

The course is designed for all youngsters, 10-14, who are interested in boating.

The course consists of eight

basic units and is designed to be taught in half-hour sessions. All course material will be furnished free to youngsters taking the course.

Plan books, work books and flip charts, all graphically illustrating basic safety requirements and precautions, will be used in teaching the course. The charts will be based on the boating safety handbook entitled "Make Sure — Make Shore".

### Historians To Lunch, Visit Town Landmarks

To quote — "One of our great needs of today is the creation of a strong spirit of loyalty to our American ideals and democratic traditions — from an understanding of the underlying principles and the forces which have shaped our American way of life. This will flow an appreciation of its advantages over any alien ideology." — Local History is Living History, pp315-375.

On May 22nd the town and county historians of Monroe County will be visiting landmarks throughout the town to participate in the Sesquicentennial of Perinton. The group will meet at the Baptist Home where at 11 A.M. Miss Alta M. Fisher, historian of Perinton, will give a brief history of the town, illustrated with Kodachromes.

Luncheon will be served at 12:30 P.M. at the Green Lantern Inn. Here Mr. Courtney Smith, advisor of Perinton, will greet the group.

Among the places of historic interest noted will be:

1. The Baptist Home
2. The Green Lantern Inn
3. The site of Glover Perrin's log cabin
4. Mallett's Tavern, the old canal tavern built in 1827 (now the Millstone Block)
5. Perinton Centre, where Samuel Bennett opened in 1796 the first blacksmith shop
6. Egrot where the first town meeting was held at Cyrus Packard's Tavern
7. Richardson's Inn at Bushnell's Basin, the western terminus of the Erie Canal while the Great Embankment was being constructed
8. Despatch (East Rochester) the boom town of 1897
9. The Denonville invasion and crossing of Irondequoit Creek, the only time a hostile army ever set foot in Perinton
10. The Lincoln Mill on the creek nearby built by Andrew Lincoln in 1821, enlarged until in 1847 the millpond covered more than fifty acres to provide the necessary water power. This site was purchased by the Town of Perinton in 1961 as a recreation area.

A traffic officer will direct the caravan and assure the safety of drivers and passengers along the way and while crossing the main thoroughfares.

Guests will be welcome for the talk, luncheon and tour. The talk on local history will be repeated at the evening meeting of the Perinton Historical Society.
