Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Vilas will leave in the near future for New York to spend the winter with their children.

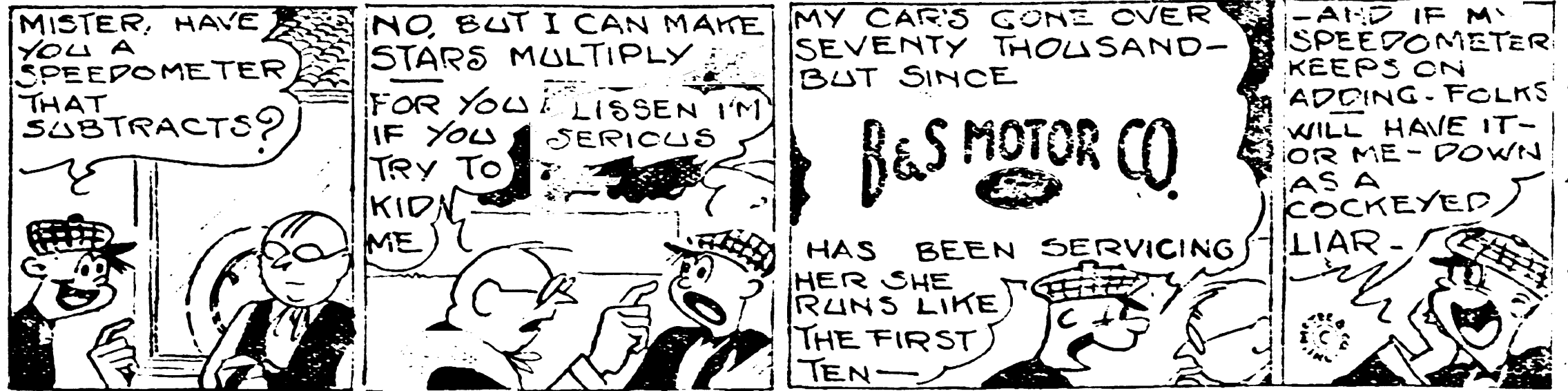
Edward B. Knecht and James Haley returned yesterday from Boston, Pa., to spend the week end with their families.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—Mayor-elect LaGuardia of New York today was a visitor in the White House and remained closeted with President Roosevelt over one hour. He refused to comment, his mood being the direct opposite of his general fighting buoyant nature. It is understood his business covered a federal loan for work relief in New York.

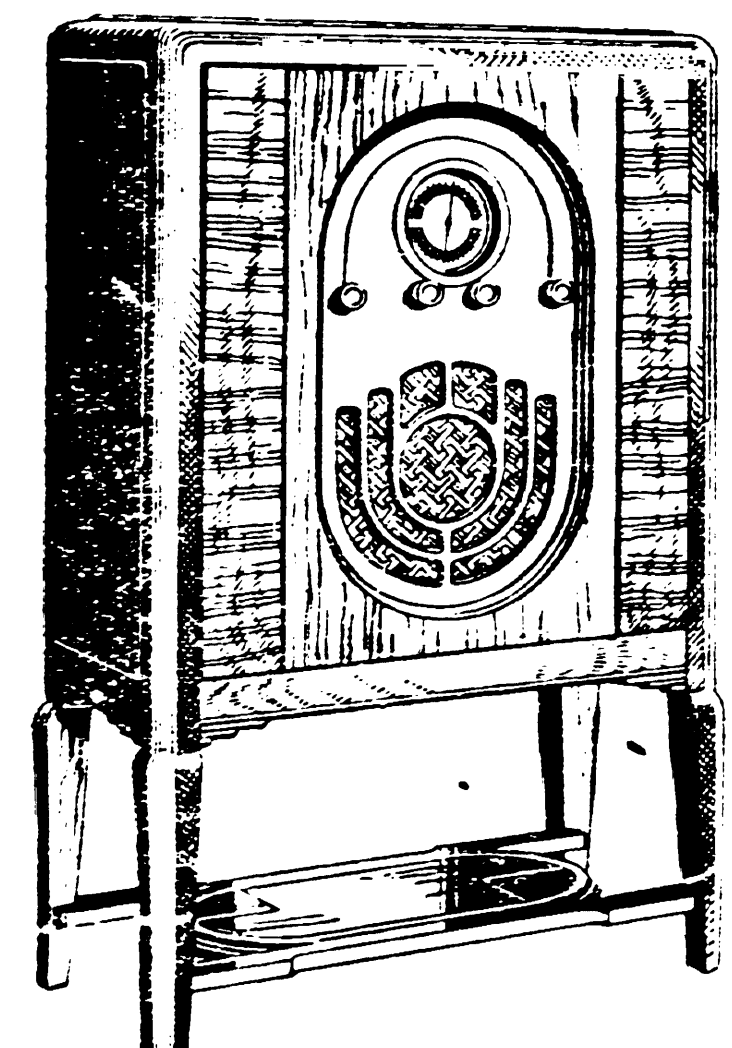

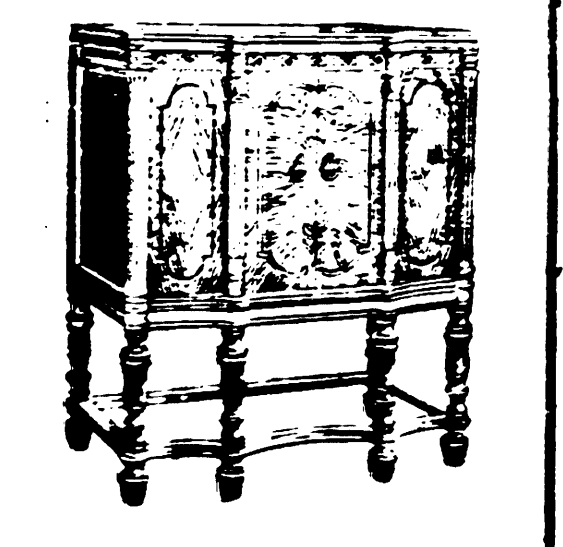
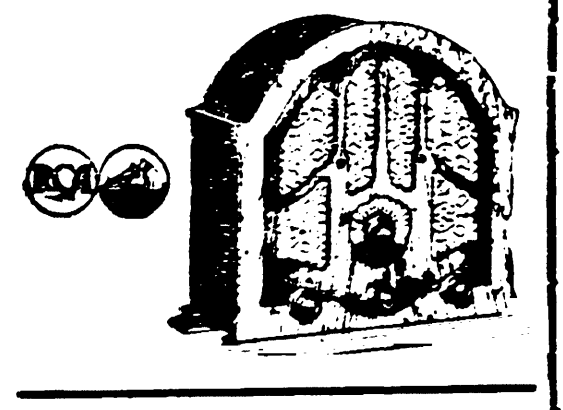
