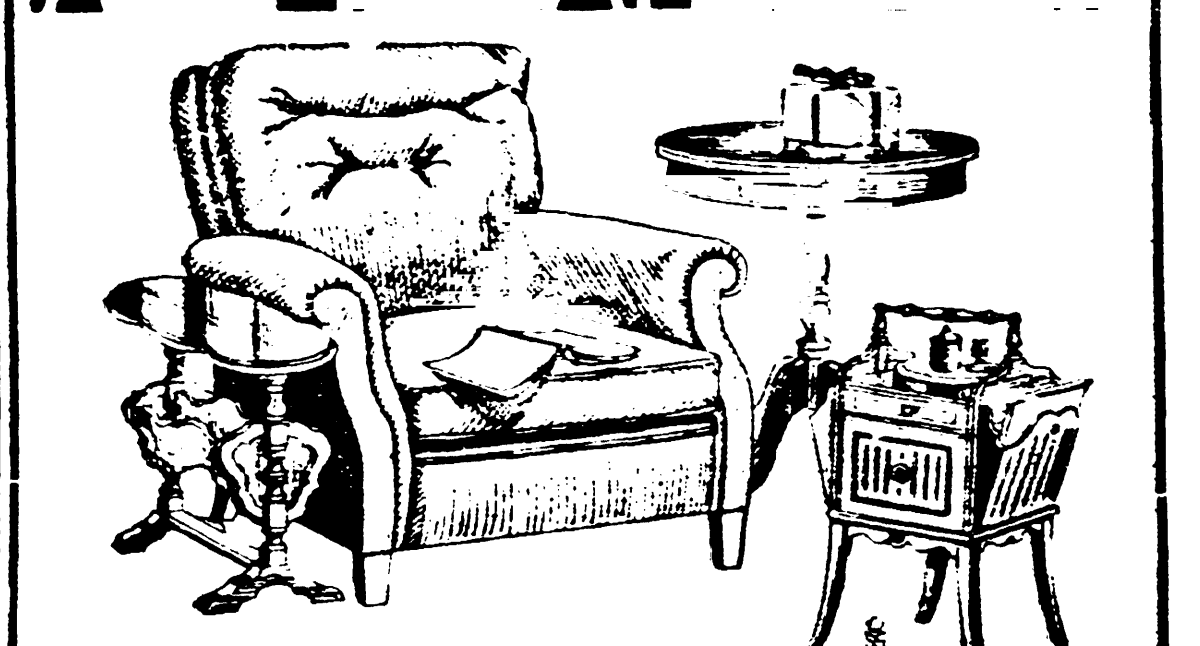
**UP TREND

**GEORGIA SURVEY SHOWS
 DISTINCT TRADE UPTURN**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—Commenting upon a survey covering 43 counties in Georgia, the Atlanta Constitution said: "Unimpeachable evidence that a distinct and steadily moving economic upturn is under way in Georgia is contained in reports from agricultural and industrial centers in every section of the State. The figures and facts give complete refutation to the claims of critics of the Federal recovery efforts." Reports from practically every one of the 43 counties showed retail business has increased from 20 to 100 percent as compared with October and November last year. Summing up substantial reemployment in factories and stores, and other signs of marked improvement, the Constitution claims there is justification for asserting that "prosperous days have returned again to this State."
