

J.P. MORGAN DIES SUDDENLY IN ROME

AGED FINANCIER RETURNS TO ITALY FROM EGYPT, WHERE HE HAS FATAL RELAPSE.

SKETCH OF HIS CAREER

Rome, March 31.—John Pierpont Morgan died here at the Grand Hotel, where he had been staying since he reached this city.

Mr. Morgan died at 12:05 o'clock. This is 6:10 o'clock New York time. It was known for many hours that Mr. Morgan was doomed.

He was unconscious at that time. His temperature had risen to 104 1/2 degrees and his pulse had mounted to 140.

John Pierpont Morgan was born on April 17, 1837, in Hartford, Conn. He was a healthy boy in a small city and was rugged and active.

There his recovery was speedy and he was soon entered as a pupil at the English High School.

His progress was remarkable, so remarkable, in fact, that when he went to study at the University of Göttingen in 1854 the professors there declared, almost to a man, that it would be a waste of genius for him to do anything but devote himself to mathematics.

John Pierpont Morgan was then second only to George Peabody in the London banking house of George Peabody & Co.

Morgan returned to Europe in 1859 and married in Paris Amelia Sturgis, daughter of Jonathan Sturgis, of New York, who was an immensely wealthy man.

In person Mr. Morgan was tall and strongly built with a body well suited to carry a head massive in all its features and of unusual size.

Although he was never athletic and indeed, by his physician's advice had taken no form of exercise for more than twenty years—because, as he was told, his great mentalty was demanding all his energies—he was singularly rapid in his movements.

His habits were simple, though he was fond of good wines and constantly smoked great black cigars.

John Pierpont Morgan was not, in the commonly accepted sense of the term, a "self-made" man.

Y., March 31.—That a longer-lived race of fowls may be developed which will be a boon to poultry husbandry, is the opinion of Professor James E. Rice of the State College of Agriculture at Cornell, as the result of the remarkable showing of two of the prize hens. Their record of productivity for three years is the highest sustained egg yield for that period.

"Cornell Supreme" laid 600 eggs in three years, her yield weighing 85.19 pounds, or 25.32 times her own weight. While the total records of "Cornell Supreme," the second crack layer is not as high, the feature of her total yield of 582 eggs is that she increased the production every year, her record being 180, 185 and 196, respectively.

These hens point out the way to possibilities in breeding that should have been realized, says Professor Rice. They prove that hens can sustain abnormally high production for three years and still remain healthy.
