NEWS BOILED DOWN.

—The Chautauqua S. S. Assembly opens August 4th.

—Bids were opened yesterday for the \$25,000 granite pedestal for the statue of the late Gen. Thomas.

—The monument erected by Sunday school scholars to the late P. P. Bliss and wife, will be dedicated next Tuesday.

—All the troops in the South, except those needed for garrison duty, will be sent to the Pacific coast to fight Indians, or to the Rio Grande to take care of the Mexican borders.

A boy named Wade, 15 years old, jumped on a moving car, near Walton, N. Y. As the train ran into the depot he was knocked off and both legs run over. Both were amputated. Recovery doubtful.

—Henry Burch, a Republican State Senator of Louisiana, was arrested on Tuesday for the embezzlement of school funds. He spent the Fourth in jail, having refused to allow a habeas corpus to be taken out in his case. He will be sent to Baton Rouge, in custody of an officer, where his trial will take place.—Ex-Gov. Wells was arrested yesterday for forgery and perjury before the Returning Board, and for counting in the Hayes electors. He was placed under \$5,000 bonds.

—At a cabinet session, yesterday, the President's order, prohibiting federal officers from participation in politics, was discussed. It was agreed that the letter of the Postmaster-General was a correct and judicious statement of the meaning of the order, in regard to cases like the one presented from Wisconsin, and that while the order should be firmly maintained and impartially enforced, there is no objection to apply it to Iowa office holders who were elected as members of Congress before it was issued, and who probably took their seats before it reached them by mail.
