MUCH NEWS IN LITTLE SPACE.

Quite a number of roads are giving in.

To-day will decide the question, and we hope without bloodshed, but anticipate and fear the worst.

The Indianapolis & St. Louis employes are on a strike. One freight train has been abandoned at Carbon.

The 110th at Hornellsville are in tents. Pullman car cushions make their beds. Blankets are minus however.

The Second Division (Brooklyn militia) has been ordered to assemble at once fully armed and equipped.

The Governor arrived at Albany last night. He has issued orders to have all the national guard prepared for active service.

A general strike took place on the New York Central to-day. That west of Rochester commenced yesterday and thus far is successful.

The President of the Reading road has offered a reward of \$10,000 for the conviction of the parties who fired the Lebanon Valley bridge.

The President of the Vandalia road, has informed the employees' committee who asked for a restoration of wages, he would answer them to-morrow; meanwhile, all freight is stopped.

It is reported that the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe road has restored the old wages. The Central Pacific Railroad has rescinded the ten per cent. reduction of June 1st, and will hereafter pay full wages in silver.

B. J. Donahue, who is the leader in the strike, at Hornellsville, was arrested between seven and eight this evening, by Sheriff Sherwood. He made no resistance. Bail was offered but he refuses to accept it, as his counsel, Horace Bemis, intends to try the validity of the arrest. The warrant, issued by Judge Donahue of New York City is returnable before him at his chambers, the 27th (Friday) of this month.
