Kodak is moving its All-America weekend event to coast this year, according to Dick Bartlett, director, Presentations and Promotions. In December, America's college football greats will be honored in San Francisco. The event has previously been held in Miami Beach and New York City.

Members of the squad, who are selected by members of the American Football Coaches Association, last year included such football superstars as Johnny Rodgers (Nebraska) and Greg Pruitt (Oklahoma) as well as Sam "Sam" Cunningham (SBC) and 21 others. Final players on the team this year will gather during the weekend of December 7-10 at the St. Francis Hotel.

The original All-America team was first named in 1916 by Yale's Walter Camp. Thirteen years ago, Kodak and the AFCA joined hands to sponsor the tournament, which now is regarded as the most prestigious of college football's honor roll teams.
