A Little Football Movies On 747

American Airlines kicked off an aerial football contest on its 747 service flight between New York and Los Angeles, Nov. 15th, in which the prize was a copy of the new NFL Encyclopedia: History of Professional Football. The book, containing 32 pages of action color photographs, has just been published by the Macmillan Publishing Co. Jerry R. Smith, American's Vice President for the New York Metropolitan area, said the book will be awarded between now and Dec. 31, to the passenger on each flight who most accurately answers questions relating to the NFL (name of the West). The 20-minute film is shown exclusively by American Airlines in its feature-length Astro-Cover service.

Contests are held about the nation's time and a 4-8 departure to Los Angeles from Kennedy International Airport here and on a p.m. flight to Los Angeles International Airport. Packed within the encyclopedia's 372 pages are stories about the NFL's history and the Super Bowl and a wealth of statistics and articles on individual players and teams.
