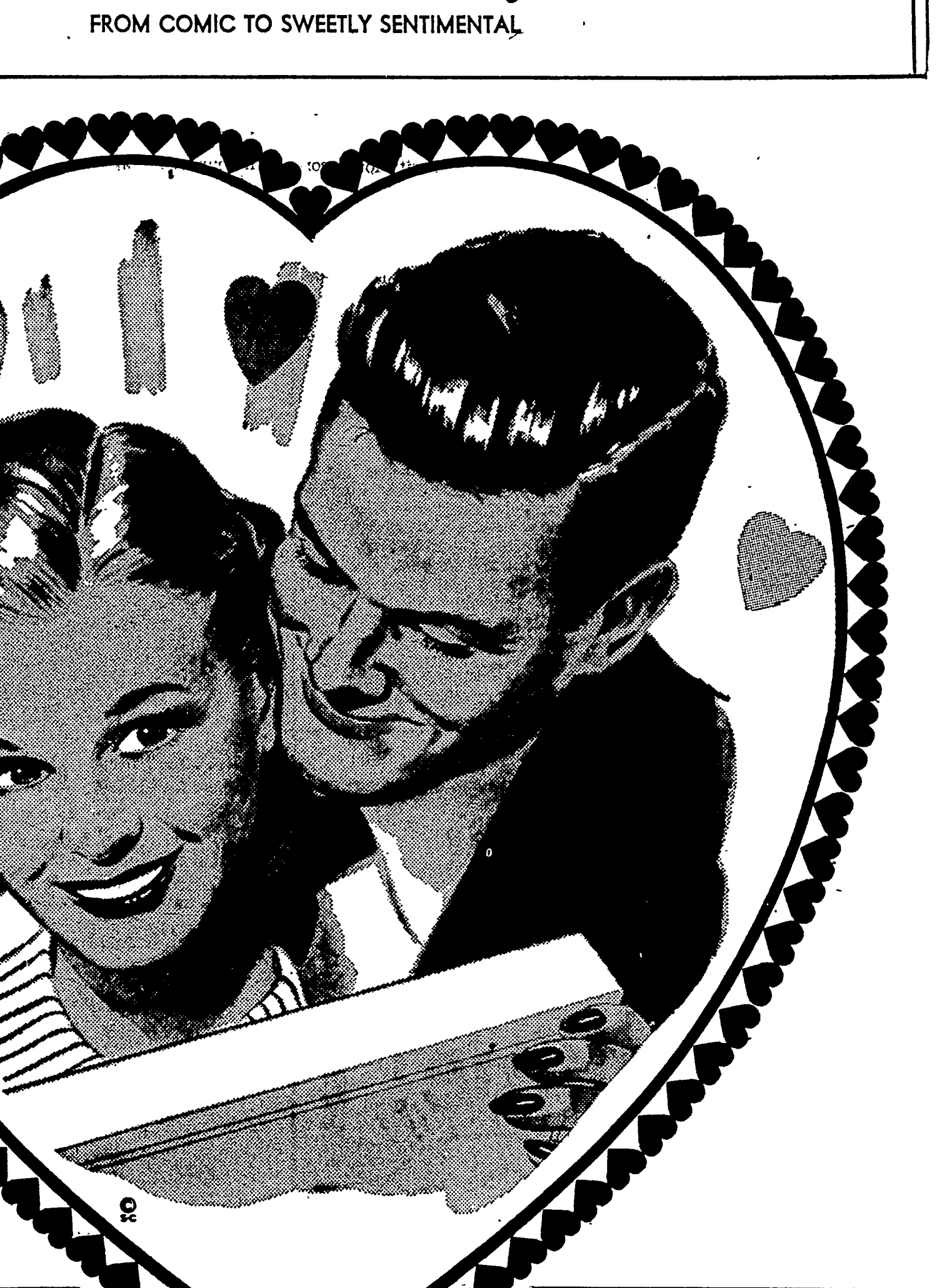
### Chappaqua Friends Attend Purchase Quarterly Meeting
