Calculating Feet in Knot.

The British admiralty knot or nautical mile is 6,080 feet and the statute knot 6,082.66 feet and is generally regarded as the standard. The number of feet in a statute knot is arrived at as follows: The circumference of the earth is divided into 360 degrees, each degree containing 360 knots or (360 by 60) 21,600 knots to the circumference; 21,600 divided into 131,385,456, the number of feet in the earth's circumference, gives 6,082.66 feet, the length of the statute knot.

Peach Tree Grown in Pot.

Recent importations of the United States bureau of plant industry include a pot-grown peach tree from Rev. George Campbell, a South China missionary. A tree only 15 inches tall ripened five good-sized edible cling stone peaches. NEW YORK NEWS

ITEMS IN BRIEF.

Paragraphs of Interest to Readers of Empire State.

Interesting News of All Kinds Gathered From Various Points in the State and So Reduced in Size That It Will Appeal to All Classes of Readers.

The heavy rain of last week and the rains later on greatly helped the crops of Niagara county, but more rain is needed for fruit. The storm came too late to save some vegetables, particularly potatoes, in many localities. Dry weather had plants burned brown.

Post No. 153, American Legion, went on record as being opposed to the appearance of Senator Wadsworth as a speaker on the Legion convention program in Rochester on Oct. 11. The post brings up the point that the senator resigned his commission at the beginning of the war.

Fourteen acres of wheat on M. L. and C. J. Buckenmeyer's home farm at West Bethany yielded 50 bushels to the acre. With the government price of wheat at \$2.26 a bushel, the yield brought more than what is considered a good price for West Bethany land, \$100 an acre.

Legislation authorizing the state department of food and markets to license all wholesale dealers in food commodities and foodstuffs, as a step toward controlling the high cost of living, was urged by the state reconstruction commission in a report submitted to Governor Smith.

Clare A. Pickard, food administrator for Chautauque county during the war, has been asked by the government to head a county committee for the regulation of food prices, insofar as permitted by law. Mr. Pickard has named a large and representative committee to assist in the service.

Twenty-two carloads of army meats and canned vegetables, two of these carloads of whole hams and strip bacon, is the total of the order of Syracuse, through Municipal Administrator Huntington B. Crouse to be placed on sale there at cost to the government and the added expense of transportation.

In spite of a fairly good crop of apples in Steuben county there will be a scarcity in fact all through the southern tier during the coming fall owing to the big demand for them for cider. Since the country went dry every farmer is storing away his barrel or two of cider and the city dwellers are doing likewise. As a result the apples available for ordinary use are very few.

Edward S. Walsh, state superintendent of public works, advocated that the state own grain elevators on the barge canal terminals at Buffalo and New York. Mr. Walsh says that some grain traffic trouble might have been overcome if there were available at Buffalo and New York state-owned elevators and that the lack of those elevators prohibited the shipping of grain by canal.

Francis M. Hugo, secretary of state; Charles S. Wilson, commissioner of agriculture, and Representative Edmund Platt, speaking at the Orange county fair at Middletown, advocated co-operation between producer and distributor to reduce the high cost of living. Representative Platt declared he did not believe that either President Wilson or congress could do much toward this end.

A merger was announced in Rochester of the Burt Onley Canning company of Oneida, Fort Stanwix Canning company of Rome, Winters & Prophet Canning company, Mt. Morris; Cobb Preserving company, Fairport and the W. H. Osborne company, Honey Falls. Under the name of the New York Canners, Inc., the new corporation, which is capitalized for \$2,250,000, the announcement says, has acquired plants in 21 cities and towns in New York, New Jersey and Maine. Principal offices will be in Rochester.

Warning that fishing, hunting and trapping within the Adirondacks forest may be forbidden upon 24 hours' notice in order to decrease the danger of forest fires was given in Albany by Conservation Commissioner G. D. Pratt. If it appears, Commissioner Pratt said, that persons now in the woods are not using care in regard to fires, Governor Smith will be asked to issue a proclamation forbidding the use of the woods until the danger, due to the unusually dry condition of the forest lands, is past. The conservation commission has also issued fire rules.
