12 oz. cream filled chocolate cookies crushed fine, 18 oz. pkg. dates pitted and cut up.

3/4 cup water
1/4 tsp. salt
2 cups miniature marshmallows
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1/2 pt. heavy cream (cool whip)
1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Reserve 1/4 cup cookie crumbs, spread remainder in a 10" by 9" by 1 1/2" pan.

In saucepan combine dates, water, salt. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer three minutes.

Remove from heat add marshmallows. Stir till melted. Stir in chopped nuts. Spread date mixture over crumbs in dish. Combine vanilla and cream. Whip stiff. Put over top of mixture in pan. Sprinkle with reserved crumbs. Chill overnight. - Mrs. Leon Farney.
