Social Security For Veterans

Persons receiving social security retirement or disability benefits, who were in the armed forces between 1957 and 1967, or the survivor beneficiaries of those who served during those years, should contact their social security office to see if additional credits will increase their monthly payments. These beneficiaries should bring the discharge certificate or other official proof of the serviceman's active military service in the 1957-1967 period. However, the amendment provides for the gratuitous wage credits beginning with 1957, when servicemen started paying social security on their basic pay. No contributions are deducted for the extra \$100 credits.
