**87 Cattle Die In Fire**

Eighty-seven head of cattle were lost in a barn fire reported at 4:17 a.m., Feb. 10, on the Bushart Road, off Route 177, Town of Harrisonburg.

The cattle, owned by Raymond Larkins, Lowville R.D., were being housed on the former Amby Williams farm.

Also lost in the blaze were an unoccupied house, a shed, hay and tools.  
The fire was reported by John Cody, who resides on Route 177, when he saw flames shooting upwards. By the time Lowville rural firemen arrived at the scene the barn and contents were burned to the ground and the house was engulfed in flames, beyond saving. Firemen said the blaze was fanned by a strong southwest wind and the fire had been burning for some time before being discovered. Firemen were at the scene an hour.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Sullivan of Carthage were among more than 400 farm couples who attended a national farm business conference in Honolulu, Hawaii, last week, sponsored by "Farm Wife News" magazine.

The conference consisted of special seminars on farm management techniques, goal setting and agri-estate planning, plus tours of selected livestock and cropping facilities.  
The farm couples flew to and from Hawaii in giant 747 jumbo jets, and stayed at the beautiful Sheraton Waikiki Hotel, located right on famous Waikiki Beach at the edge of the Pacific. The conference included a mid-week flight to the island of Maui, where the farm group toured the research facilities of a major seed firm, and viewed no-tillage plots especially planned for the conference to show no-till crops in the growing stage.

According to the Sullivans, temperatures were in the high 70's and low 80's for the entire week. Just prior to departure, at the end of the week-long conference, the group toured Pearl Harbor and several more of Hawaii's scenic sites.
