New Films Available

North Country Library System has recently completed the purchase of 65 films under a \$10,000 New York State Council on the Arts grant. Most of the films are dramatizations of plays and short stories, or works on music, dance, art and poetry. Some of the finest films do not fit into these categories, but several feature films and silent comedies have been purchased under the grant.

Any interested group is invited to arrange a series of showings.

They may reserve them at the nearest public library in Jefferson, Lewis, Oswego and St. Lawrence counties. It is expected the films will be heavily used and they should be booked as far ahead of showing as possible.

Each group must arrange for a projector and an experienced projectionist. (In Lowville, a projector may be borrowed from the Lowville Free Library.) There will be no charge to any group other than the public schools, which pay a \$2 per film handling charge.
