On last Thursday evening, this nation watched the results of one of its forms of democracy in action. Mr. Gerald Ford was elected to the office of the Vice-President of the United States by a process allowed by the last amendment to the constitution of these United States. In spite of the disappointment in the integrity and judgment of individuals in our government, the process of our government goes along and serves as it can the interest of all of its citizens. D. Stoffle Dead At 68

David Stoffle, 68, of 160 Main Street, Boonville, died Dec. 2 in St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Ulica, where he had been a patient three weeks. He had been seriously ill since July. He was born at Lowville, January 1905, a son of Nicholas and Lora Bowman Stoffle, and spent his young life at Lowville. For a time he was employed by Smith Oil Co., Niagara Falls and Re. Lorraine and Jones, all of Lowville. He entered the Army in May, 1943, and served with the 95th general hospital unit in England and France. He was discharged in 1945. Upon his return he located in Boonville where he operated his own business as a cattle dealer. He married Ethel Patmore of Boonville, July 2, 1937, at Ilion. He was a member of the Balsam Flats Hunting and Fishing Club, a former member of the V.F.W. and American Legion and former member of the Lowville Fire Department and Lowville Moose Lodge. Mr. Stoffle is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ethel P. Stoffle; several cousins and nieces and nephews. He was the last member of a family of three brothers and sisters. The funeral was scheduled for Dec. 6 at 2:30 p.m. at the Trainor Funeral Home, Rev. Rollo D. Pierce, pastor of the Boonville Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was to be in Boonville Cemetery.

While we are all appalled and in great disappointment about the Watergate scandal and all of its implications, I am sure we are all proud of the nation and the structure of the government which can withstand such internal stress and strain.
