**GARDEN PEAS:** If you're one of those gardeners who has a fine crop of pea vines which deteriorate at the first sign of hot weather, then you should know about the Wando pea. Here is a garden pea that breaks all the rules in the books and bears a heavy crop of tender peas during hot weather. Wando is a heat-resistant pea you can plant as late as the 1st of July and get a good crop of high quality peas, even in hot summer weather. With ordinary garden peas you have to get them in the ground in April since they are normally a cool-weather vegetable, but Wando can be planted late and still give you excellent crop in August or September. Wando bears well, freezes well, maturing in 68 days.

Make successive sowings of peas until the first of July. Make a trench 2 inches deep and scatter the peas so they're close together about an inch apart. Rows can be 2 1/2 ft. apart and it takes about a pound to sow 100 ft. of row.

**PRUNE EVERGREENS:** Right now's a good time to nip your evergreens so they'll stay compact and bushy. Don't neglect these bushes around your home or they'll ruin your landscape picture. The spreading types can be nipped back so they're irregular, not sheared or clipped. Looking down from the top, these spreading evergreens should have that zig-zagged effect, or more or less a star shaped appearance. Never

shear a spreader into a round ball. Uprights can stand more shearing since their habit of growth isn't so graceful or lacy. The top can be trimmed back to the height you want and left that way year after year. **FREE:** Raising evergreens is a simple job. **GREEN THUMB CLINIC:** G. L. of Lowville. "We received a fine lily plant for Easter. Please tell

us how to care for it so we can make it bloom again next year. Give the lily lots of water, and a temperature of 65 to 70 degs. If foliage turns yellow, it may be due to lack of light, too much water or not enough. Sometimes, high temperature causes yellowing of leaves. Reach inside blooms and pull out the yellow floral parts, the anthers or male elements. This keeps blossoms clean, flowers fresher longer. After lily has finished blooming, plant it in the garden in May and leave it there permanently. Never force it again indoors.

**Lowville Allocates  
\$1000 for Youth

An application for State-aid submitted by Mayor Reuben J. Herzig indicates that the Village will spend a total of \$2,360 during the year to provide a recreation program. Activities to be provided include swimming instructions and ice skating.

Facilities to be used include Lowville Park Playground, Low-

ville School Playground and Crystal Lake or some other approved lake in the vicinity.

The agency responsible for the conduct of this program is the Village Board of Trustees of which Mayor Reuben J. Herzig is chairman.

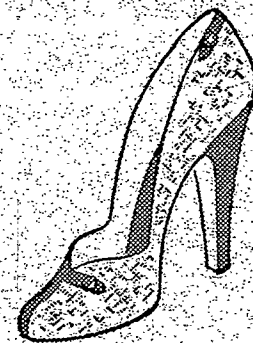
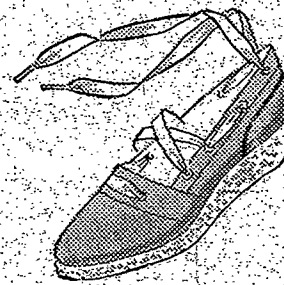
