KING HUMBERT ASSASSINATED.

in the presence of the United Chamber. He is already King Emmanuel III there being no formal coronation on occasion of this sort in Italy.

ROME July 19. The name of Angelo Brocc, cannot be found on the Police list of anarchists. The Popolo Romano stated the Messengers declare that the assassination is due to King Humbert's great love for the working classes.

The body of King Humbert of Italy lies today in a chamber of the Royal Palace at Monza. It has been taken there from the city where he was shot by an anarchist.

The assassination of Humbert came like a bolt from a clear sky. There was no political crisis in Italy and no struggle between the parties had been going on for some time past.

The Minister of War has ordered that the garrisons at Milan, Florence, Naples and other cities be strengthened and held in readiness for instant action.

The king is being rapidly draped in black. Pictures of Humbert in black frames have been hung out on many buildings and flags are at half mast.

The king while before a funeral service in the city was beloved because of his general friendliness with the people and his sense of humor.

Details of the assassination are awaited with eagerness but the authorities for some reason are still holding the participation of the League.

WASHINGTON July 19. The President this morning sent the following message to the successor of King Humbert:

DEPARTMENT OF STATE, Washington, July 19, 1908. His Majesty Vittorio Emanuele III.

I am, in the name and on behalf of the American people, offering your Majesty and the Italian nation my cordial congratulations on the hour of your accession to the throne.

FIRE ON A SHIP.

PHILADELPHIA July 19. The steaming tugboat of the United Line, heading between New York and this city, was sunk off the tangle of the coast yesterday.

Fire was discovered in her hold while she was on her way up the Delaware bay Sunday morning.

She arrived at Camden at 7 o'clock with the fire just breaking through her deck in the rear.

When off Camden a captain French had the small boats dropped and set men to work to open her bottom.
