THE BARREL PLAYERS ASSOCIATION

Now that the barrel players are no longer a novelty, it will be interesting to watch developments between the workmen and the moneyed men of the national game. It was expected that the latter would try to strangle the movement at its inception, but so far they have done nothing. Perhaps the magnates are well aware that they are not popular with the masses, and therefore deem it wise to make no trouble.

So far the players have acted in a very sensible fashion and if they go on as they have begun will have the sympathy of the public. They have done no loud talking or bragging of what they will do for their employers, but have quietly gone ahead and perfected their organization and got the professionals all over the country interested before saying too much. The men selected for the responsible positions in the organization are well known players who have conducted themselves in a proper manner on and off the field.

The leaders must be careful that both sides are not allowed to get in control or to do anything to make the movement unpopular.

It is known that the first evil the new body hopes to abolish is that of farming out men capable of playing to the major league to some minor league. It is already known that some of the magnates are in favor of making concessions to the players and of taking their matter to a quiet way not only in regard to the farming out evil, but also the reserve rule and other matters.

There are not at present many persons who take an interest in the politics of France, but if you happen to be among those who do, just keep your eye on Waldeck Rousseau and General de Gallifet. Rousseau is the premier and Gallifet is the minister of war.

The latter's straightforward course during the difficult situation of the world's peace, however, although occupying a more exalted position has not been entirely successful. He is now in a quiet way in the hands of the French people. The last session of the French parliament in the most unexpected manner gave him a position which he is not likely to survive. His enemies had always regarded Waldeck Rousseau as a man who would never be a premier to whom fortune had been kindly. During the session just closed they determined to carry the premier to desolation in the hope that he would resign. They sought to attain their end by means of a vote of censure and applying interpretations. Waldeck Rousseau, however, stuck to the belt and never once wavered. Instinctively he displayed powers of leadership which surprised friends and foes alike. Already there is talk of retaining him as Waldeck Rousseau or General de Gallifet for president when that functionary is next chosen.

WEEKLY CROP BULLETIN

(Prepared by the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture, Office of Experiment Stations, with the assistance of the State Agricultural Experiment Stations.)
WEEK ENDING FRIDAY, AUG. 22, 1900.

Excepting a few interior counties south of the central Lake Region and bordering on Pennsylvania, where the rainfall was sufficient, the last week was exceptionally favorable for the rapid growth of crops. Heavy rains fell over the greater portion of the State especially over the eastern half. 1.50 to 4.00 inches being reported in the southeast quarter.

The temperatures were also favorable. A marked and encouraging improvement is noted in the condition of all crops, not already beyond recovery. Buckwheat is much improved, with prospects of a fairly good crop. The condition of corn is generally promising. Early planted potatoes prospered seriously by drought, with prospects of a very light yield. The late planted crop is generally well advanced, and will probably be a good yield of fine quality. The harvest of oats is about half the crop general. The late planted corn and melons are much revived. Grapes will be abundant. While there is considerable complaint as to the dropping of apples, the reports from generally indicate a good crop generally. Fall plowing is being rapidly advanced, and is finished in places.
