VITAL STATISTICS.

For the Month of February Made Public by the Registrar.

The report of vital statistics for the month of February, as given out by Registrar Grossich, shows that during the past month there were 31 births, 17 deaths and 11 marriages in the city. Compared with corresponding period in the past two years there is a creditable increase in deaths and a gratifying increase in both births and marriages. During February of 1900, there were reported to the Health Department, 24 births, 17 deaths and 7 marriages. In the list of deaths for February of this year, there were six males and eight females who died. Two persons lived beyond eighty years, and four persons aged ranged between 70 and 80 years. Two persons died of old age, two of heart failure, two of pneumonia, one of typhoid fever, one of typhoid fever, one of convulsions, one of asthma, one of diabetes, one of paralysis. Five persons died under 20 years of age. In the list of 31 births reported, 13 were males and 18 females. The list of 11 marriages, five grocers were born in Dunkirk and seven brides were residents of the city. Three grooms and three brides came from Pennsylvania and one groom and one bride from Ohio. Nine grooms and nine brides were under 25 years of age. The oldest groom was 37 and the oldest bride 44 years.

FIRED AT THE CROWD

Ruthven used a Revolver When Attacked While Delivering a Lecture.

LONDON, March 4.—Ruthven, the former priest, who recently used a Catholic nominal before libel and was awarded nominal damages tried to lecture in Dunkirk, late last night and was mobbed by his auditors. Ruthven fired a revolver at the crowd, the bullet striking a man in the chest. The priest was arrested. Ruthven according to allegations made by the priest travelled in America under the name of Richard. It is said he was well known at Erie, Penn.

BURIED THEIR PARENTS.
