MILITARY RIFLES.

The development of the military rifle, while a matter of surprise to many, has not been rapid in one solid stride. True, the improvements are many and it sometimes seems as though perfection were nearly reached, but a careful examination shows something to be desired. When inclined to be satisfied with what has already been accomplished, it is well to remember that this same complacent feeling has always existed, each change of rifle and each new bullet being hailed as something which would admit of no further improvement. It is plain that the range is sufficient for all practical purposes, as in actual service no soldier, even if a sharpshooter, will ever be called upon to fire at a greater distance than the gun now furnished will carry with accuracy, besides, in consequence of the smoke which is nearly every instance obscures a rifleman from one of his comrades, and in consequence of this range, there is consequently no objection to military arms on account of lack of range or precision, and there is no question raised as to their effectiveness...

As we now consider what changes in military arms and ammunition are desirable, a factor of great importance is the fact that the soldier who is not inspired thereby, as the soldier would not then waste so many shots through misadventure, but would secure an arm of smaller caliber, and if this change can be satisfactorily effected, it will result beneficially in various ways. The soldier would thus be enabled to carry a greater quantity of ammunition, and the weight of his pack would be lessened, and his gun will be lighter. The same advantages apply to ammunition trains, made with great care and at less expense. It would be difficult to conceive how the intricacy of the rifle, and the durability of modern military arms is susceptible of improvement...
