Cattle and Poultry as Weather Prophets

Can meteorologists, even with the aid of wireless, forecast weather with more accuracy than country folk who watch nature's own barometers? If cattle in a field scratch themselves vigorously, or stand with their tails to the wind the countryman will tell you it is going to rain and his prediction is invariably correct. If the fowls come out to feed on a wet morning there is little chance of it clearing up that day, says the Flower Grower. The appearance of toads, frogs and earthworms in unusual numbers invariably means rain, and so do the singing of blackbirds, the falling of soot or the cracking of furniture. If the ants in the garden build their walls frequently or the house sparrow keeps to the ridge country residents prepare for rain, though if birds frequent the eaves they will confidently prophesy fine weather.

Storms from the northwest or southwest, are usually brief, but a storm from the northeast is likely to be long and severe. A veering wind brings fine weather, a backing wind means rain. These are the countryman's barometer. Their significance is based upon the observation and experience of centuries, and the forecast made from them is quite as reliable as any issued from the meteorological observatories.

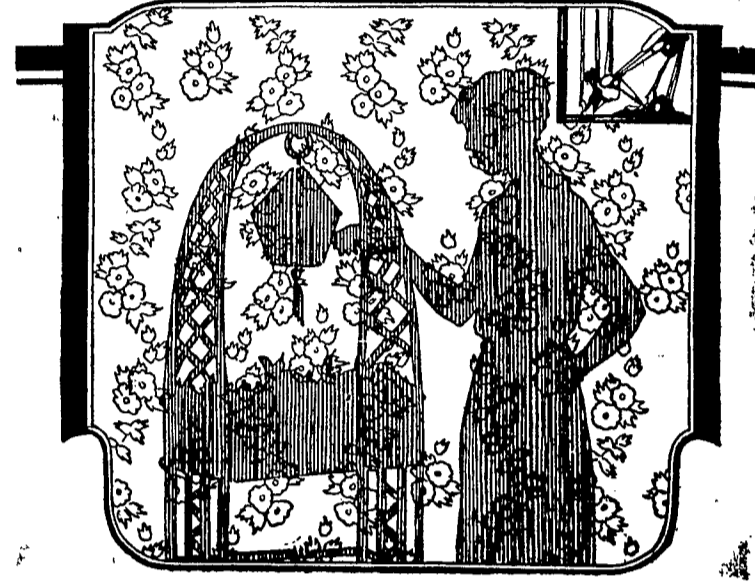

WHIPPED CREAM CAKE

Any good white cake recipe will do for this, but the one used is as follows: 1/4 cupful of butter, 1 cupful of sugar, 2 cupfuls of cake flour, 3 teaspoonfuls of baking powder, 3 egg whites, 2-3 cupful of milk, 1/2 teaspoonful of vanilla or orange flavoring. Cream the butter and sugar and add to it alternately a bit of the flour which has been sifted with the baking powder, a bit of milk, and so on until the required quantities of both have been used. Add the flavoring; lastly fold in the beaten egg whites, and bake in two layers in a moderate oven—about 300 degrees. When ready to use the cake, fill with one cupful of whipped cream and serve in slices on individual plates.

Peak of Luxury in Great Lakes Vacation Travel Provided by Two New Leviathans Costing \$7,000,000

Two giant passenger steamships, known as the Leviathans of the Great Lakes, will be placed in service in May between Detroit, Mich., and Buffalo, N. Y. These new boats, the largest of their type ever constructed, embody the peak of luxury in steamship travel. They are being brought out at a cost of \$7,000,000 by the Detroit & Cleveland Navigation Company, and will increase the carrying capacity between Detroit and Buffalo 70 per cent.

Many innovations in lake travel have been incorporated in both ships. All parlors, de luxe are located forward of the main chinery and large number of single berth rooms have been provided. All ocean passenger steamship lines have single berth rooms but on the Great Lakes, heretofore, passengers traveling alone desiring a room for themselves, have been compelled to purchase a two-berth room.

The smoking room on the Greater Detroit and Greater Buffalo, the new two steamships, are placed in the stern on the promenade deck. They are large airy rooms with windows sweeping in a great semi-circle from one side of the boat to the other

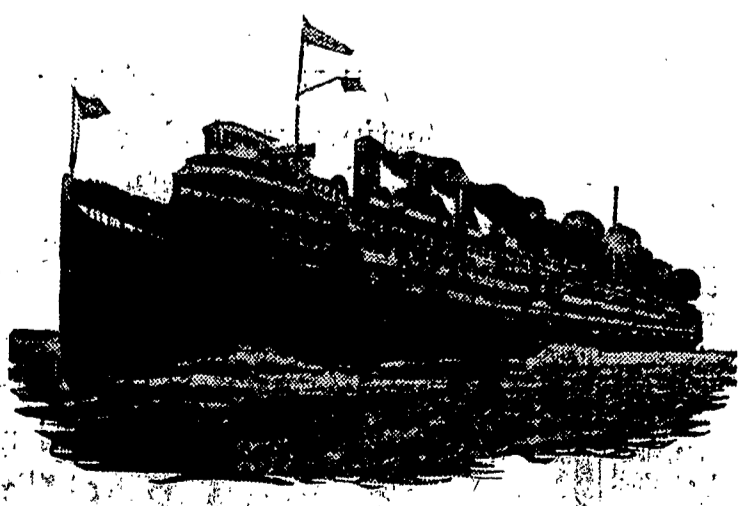
affording an unobstructed view of the lake and river in all directions. The new boats each have 660 rooms for passengers with sleeping accommodations for 1500 people. There are also accommodations for a crew of 300. The Leviathan, one of the largest of the trans-Atlantic passenger fleet,

developing 10,000 horsepower. Telephone connect every room with a central station in the lobby. Complete wireless equipment is carried.

There are motion picture machines and many other features for the amusement and entertainment of passengers. The great lobbies and salons are finished in period styles of architecture. The ships are beautifully decorated and completely and luxuriously furnished throughout.

With the opening of the 1925 season on the Great Lakes, the steamers City of Detroit III and the City of Cleveland III formerly on the Buffalo-Detroit division will alternate on the Detroit-Cleveland division, increasing the carrying capacity of this route 50 per cent. The steamers Eastern States and Western States which have been completely overhauled and refurnished will be placed in service on a new division to be established between Detroit, Mich., and Chicago, Ill., with one stop at Mackinac Island. A forty-hour express schedule, the fastest ever made between these two ports, will be maintained with sailings three times a week from Detroit and Chicago.

The Greater Buffalo and Greater Detroit are each 550 feet long with a beam of 100 feet. In every detail of construction, the boats represent the highest peak yet achieved in American shipbuilding. A maximum speed of 25 miles an hour can easily be maintained by the powerful engines
