Items of News Pertaining to Cape Vincent and Vicinity.

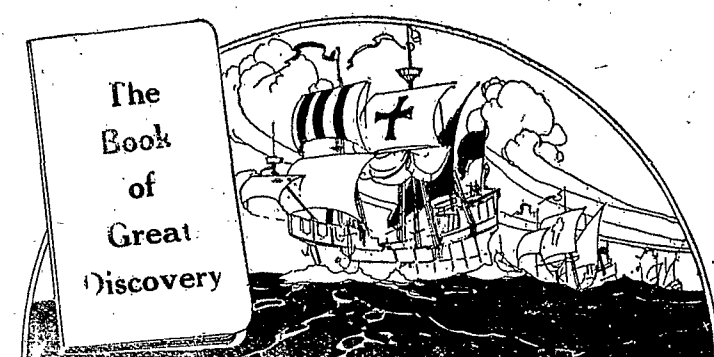
