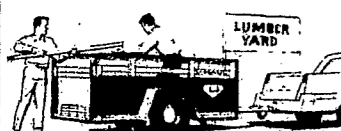

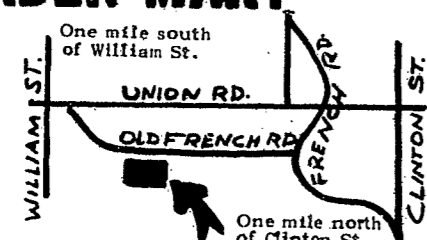

**Iroquois Brewing Corp. Creates New Western Hospitality Center**

Mr. Fox estimates that some 30,000 people have toured the brewery in the past 18 months and predicts that this figure will more than double now that both the new Indian Head Saloon and the Rathskellar hospitality rooms are available.

Raymond A. Zembrycki, brewery vice president, was assigned the task of converting a former sales office into the Indian Head Saloon. With the timetable calling for early completion to help ease the backlog of scheduled tours that was creating a log jam in bookings, Mr. Zembrycki pulled out all the stops.

The result is a Western motif hospitality room that would do credit to the most meticulous Hollywood designer—creating an epic setting for a face-to-face showdown between hero and villain.

Memorabilia of the era permeates the room, from a hitching post veranda, leaded glass windows and swinging doors, to the pine plant floor, beam ceiling, and flickering gas-type globe lights.

The furniture and props are right out of the pages of the West: Pot-bellied stove with old-fashioned metal coffee pot, player piano, brass-railed bar, spittoon, elevated stage with red satin curtain and a drop curtain decorated in this case with the

"business cards" of real honest-to-goodness area residents who now happen to be in the business of distributing Iroquois beverages.

From one of the Iridirectors, George J. Patterson Jr., came an especially appropriate gift of useful props, including Civil War and Wild West rifles, branding irons, and saddle. The massive bar was located—after a hunt that covered many miles and much effort—just two doors away! An abandoned and sealed off attic in a Downtown hostelry produced a practically priceless collection of straight-backed chairs that were typical of the day. Neatly framed by a pair of mirrors over the bar is a large replica of a favorite painting of the day, a female more undraped than draped.

No matter whether you are a dyed-in-the-saddle Western aficionado or just plain tourist, brewery visitors will find many more interesting and authentic artifacts lending flavor and distinction to the Indian Head Saloon and there's a story behind every item which Proprietor Fox and his associates are hankering to share with their guests.

Brewery tours may be arranged by contacting local Iroquois distributors or by calling the brewery direct. At present, tours are being scheduled Monday through Friday evenings for groups up to 150 people.

The Indian Head Saloon was created by Iroquois Brewing Co. to meet a demand for space to accommodate the growing numbers of Buffalo and area people visiting the brewery at Broadway and Pratt Streets in the heart of the Buffalo business district.

"This hospitality room doubles to 150 people the number of guests who can now participate in our daily tours," explains Terence J. Fox, proprietor of the Indian Head Saloon who also doubles as president and chief executive officer of the brewery.

"With the Rathskellar booked up beyond the first of the year we just had to do something. Turning people away just isn't good business, especially when we know that brewery visitors become loyal Iroquois boosters. People tell us the tours are both educational and fun. They've become the 'in thing' to do around Buffalo, it seems."
